1       AN ACT Relating to protecting dependent persons by changing the  
2 crimes of criminal mistreatment and abandonment of a dependent person;  
3 amending RCW 9A.42.010, 9A.42.020, 9A.42.030, 9A.42.035, 9A.42.037,  
4 9A.42.060, 9A.42.070, and 9A.42.080; reenacting and amending RCW  
5 9.94A.515; prescribing penalties; providing an effective date; and  
6 declaring an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8       **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.42.010 and 1997 c 392 s 508 are each amended to  
9 read as follows:

10       As used in this chapter:

11       (1) "Basic necessities of life" means food, water, shelter,  
12 clothing, and medically necessary health care, including but not  
13 limited to health-related treatment or activities, hygiene, oxygen, and  
14 medication.

15       (2)(a) "Bodily injury" means physical pain or injury, illness, or  
16 an impairment of physical condition;

17       (b) "Substantial bodily harm" means bodily injury which involves a  
18 temporary but substantial disfigurement, or which causes a temporary

1 but substantial loss or impairment of the function of any bodily part  
2 or organ, or which causes a fracture of any bodily part;

3 (c) "Great bodily harm" means bodily injury which creates a high  
4 probability of death, or which causes serious permanent disfigurement,  
5 or which causes a permanent or protracted loss or impairment of the  
6 function of any bodily part or organ.

7 (3) "Child" means a person under eighteen years of age.

8 (4) "Dependent person" means a person who, because of physical or  
9 mental disability, or because of extreme advanced age, is dependent  
10 upon another person to provide the basic necessities of life. A  
11 resident of a nursing home, as defined in RCW 18.51.010, a resident of  
12 an adult family home, as defined in RCW 70.128.010, and a frail elder  
13 or vulnerable adult, as defined in RCW 74.34.020(~~((+8))~~) (13), is  
14 presumed to be a dependent person for purposes of this chapter.

15 (5) "Employed" means hired by a dependent person, another person  
16 acting on behalf of a dependent person, or by an organization or  
17 governmental entity, to provide to a dependent person any of the basic  
18 necessities of life. A person may be "employed" regardless of whether  
19 the person is paid for the services or, if paid, regardless of who pays  
20 for the person's services.

21 (6) "Parent" has its ordinary meaning and also includes a guardian  
22 and the authorized agent of a parent or guardian.

23 (7) "Abandons" means leaving a child or other dependent person  
24 without the means or ability to obtain one or more of the basic  
25 necessities of life.

26 (8) "Good samaritan" means any individual or group of individuals  
27 who: (a) Is not related to the dependent person; (b) voluntarily  
28 provides assistance or services of any type to the dependent person;  
29 and (c) is not paid or otherwise compensated by the dependent person,  
30 the dependent person's family, or the dependent person's estate in  
31 exchange for the assistance or services provided.

32 **Sec. 2.** RCW 9A.42.020 and 1997 c 392 s 510 are each amended to  
33 read as follows:

34 (1) A parent of a child, the person entrusted with the physical  
35 custody of a child or dependent person, a person who has assumed the  
36 responsibility to provide to a dependent person the basic necessities  
37 of life, or a person employed to provide to the child or dependent

1 person the basic necessities of life is guilty of criminal mistreatment  
2 in the first degree if he or she recklessly, as defined in RCW  
3 9A.08.010, causes great bodily harm to a child or dependent person by  
4 withholding any of the basic necessities of life.

5 (2) Criminal mistreatment in the first degree is a class B felony.

6 **Sec. 3.** RCW 9A.42.030 and 1997 c 392 s 511 are each amended to  
7 read as follows:

8 (1) A parent of a child, the person entrusted with the physical  
9 custody of a child or dependent person, a person who has assumed the  
10 responsibility to provide to a dependent person the basic necessities  
11 of life, or a person employed to provide to the child or dependent  
12 person the basic necessities of life is guilty of criminal mistreatment  
13 in the second degree if he or she recklessly, as defined in RCW  
14 9A.08.010, either (a) creates an imminent and substantial risk of death  
15 or great bodily harm, or (b) causes substantial bodily harm by  
16 withholding any of the basic necessities of life.

17 (2) Criminal mistreatment in the second degree is a class C felony.

18 **Sec. 4.** RCW 9A.42.035 and 2000 c 76 s 1 are each amended to read  
19 as follows:

20 (1) A person is guilty of the crime of criminal mistreatment in the  
21 third degree if the person is the parent of a child, is a person  
22 entrusted with the physical custody of a child or other dependent  
23 person, is a person who has assumed the responsibility to provide to a  
24 dependent person the basic necessities of life, or is a person employed  
25 to provide to the child or dependent person the basic necessities of  
26 life, and either:

27 (a) With criminal negligence, creates an imminent and substantial  
28 risk of substantial bodily harm to a child or dependent person by  
29 withholding any of the basic necessities of life; or

30 (b) With criminal negligence, causes substantial bodily harm to a  
31 child or dependent person by withholding any of the basic necessities  
32 of life.

33 (2) For purposes of this section, "a person who has assumed the  
34 responsibility to provide to a dependent person the basic necessities  
35 of life" means a person other than: (a) A government agency that

1 regularly provides assistance or services to dependent persons,  
2 including but not limited to the department of social and health  
3 services; or (b) a good samaritan as defined in RCW 9A.42.010.

4 (3) Criminal mistreatment in the third degree is a gross  
5 misdemeanor.

6 **Sec. 5.** RCW 9A.42.037 and 2002 c 219 s 2 are each amended to read  
7 as follows:

8 (1) A person is guilty of the crime of criminal mistreatment in the  
9 fourth degree if the person is the parent of a child, is a person  
10 entrusted with the physical custody of a child or other dependent  
11 person, is a person who has assumed the responsibility to provide to a  
12 dependent person the basic necessities of life, or is a person employed  
13 to provide to the child or dependent person the basic necessities of  
14 life, and either:

15 (a) With criminal negligence, creates an imminent and substantial  
16 risk of bodily injury to a child or dependent person by withholding any  
17 of the basic necessities of life; or

18 (b) With criminal negligence, causes bodily injury or extreme  
19 emotional distress manifested by more than transient physical symptoms  
20 to a child or dependent person by withholding the basic necessities of  
21 life.

22 (2) For purposes of this section, "a person who has assumed the  
23 responsibility to provide to a dependent person the basic necessities  
24 of life" means a person other than: (a) A government agency that  
25 regularly provides assistance or services to dependent persons,  
26 including but not limited to the department of social and health  
27 services; or (b) a good samaritan as defined in RCW 9A.42.010.

28 (3) Criminal mistreatment in the fourth degree is a misdemeanor.

32 is guilty of the crime of abandonment of a dependent person in the  
33 first degree if:

1 has assumed the responsibility to provide to a dependent person the  
2 basic necessities of life, or a person employed to provide to the child  
3 or other dependent person any of the basic necessities of life;

4 (b) The person recklessly abandons the child or other dependent  
5 person; and

6 (c) As a result of being abandoned, the child or other dependent  
7 person suffers great bodily harm.

8 (2) A parent of a newborn who transfers the newborn to a qualified  
9 person at an appropriate location pursuant to RCW 13.34.360 is not  
10 subject to criminal liability under this section.

11 (3) Abandonment of a dependent person in the first degree is a  
12 class B felony.

26 person suffers substantial bodily harm; or

27 (ii) Abandoning the child or other dependent person creates an

30 (2) A parent of a newborn who transfers the newborn to a qualified  
31 person at an appropriate location pursuant to RCW 13.34.360 is not  
32 subject to criminal liability under this section.

33 (3) Abandonment of a dependent person in the second degree is a  
34 class C felony.

7 basic necessities of life, or a person employed to provide to the child

11 (i) As a result of being abandoned, the child or other dependent  
12 person suffers bodily harm; or

13 (ii) Abandoning the child or other dependent person creates an  
14 imminent and substantial risk that the child or other person will  
15 suffer substantial bodily harm.

16 (2) A parent of a newborn who transfers the newborn to a qualified  
17 person at an appropriate location pursuant to RCW 13.34.360 is not  
18 subject to criminal liability under this section.

19 (3) Abandonment of a dependent person in the third degree is a  
20 gross misdemeanor.
