- AN ACT Relating to failing to summon assistance; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 9A.36 RCW; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 9A.36 RCW to read as follows:
 - A person is guilty of the crime of failing to summon assistance if:
- 7 (1)(a) He or she was present when a crime was committed against 8 another person; or (b) he or she was made aware that a crime was 9 committed against another person by someone who was present when the
- 10 crime was committed against the other person; and
- 11 (2) He or she knows that the other person has suffered substantial 12 bodily harm as a result of the crime committed against the other person 13 and that the other person is in need of assistance; and
- 14 (3) He or she could reasonably summon assistance for the person in 15 need without danger to himself or herself and without interference with 16 an important duty owed to a third party; and
- 17 (4) He or she fails to summon assistance for the person in need;

- 1 (5) Another person is not summoning or has not summoned assistance 2 for the person in need of such assistance.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 9A.36 RCW 4 to read as follows:
- 5 A violation of section 1 of this act is a misdemeanor.
