- 1 AN ACT Relating to membership on community college boards of 2 trustees; and amending RCW 28B.50.100.

- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.50.100 and 1991 c 238 s 37 are each amended to read as follows:
 - There is hereby created a board of trustees for each college district as set forth in this chapter. Each board of trustees shall be composed of five trustees, who shall be appointed by the governor for terms commencing October 1st of the year in which appointed. In making such appointments the governor shall give consideration to geographical diversity, and representing labor, business, women, and racial and ethnic minorities, in the membership of the boards of trustees. The boards of trustees for ((districts containing technical colleges)) each college district shall include at least one member from business and one member from labor.
- The successors of the trustees initially appointed shall be appointed by the governor to serve for a term of five years except that any person appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to the

expiration of any term shall be appointed only for the remainder of the term. Each member shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified.

If, as of the effective date of this section, a board of trustees does not include at least one member from business and one member from labor, the governor shall fill the next vacancy or make the next new appointment with a business or labor member until the board has the composition required under this section.

Every trustee shall be a resident and qualified elector of the college district. No trustee may be an employee of the community and technical college system, a member of the board of directors of any school district, or a member of the governing board of any public or private educational institution.

Each board of trustees shall organize itself by electing a chairman from its members. The board shall adopt a seal and may adopt such bylaws, rules and regulations as it deems necessary for its own government. Three members of the board shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser number may adjourn from time to time and may compel the attendance of absent members in such manner as prescribed in its bylaws, rules, or regulations. The district president, or if there be none, the president of the college, shall serve as, or may designate another person to serve as, the secretary of the board, who shall not be deemed to be a member of the board.

Members of the boards of trustees may be removed for misconduct or malfeasance in office in the manner provided by RCW 28B.10.500.
