- 1 AN ACT Relating to mail ballot elections; and amending RCW
- 2 29A.48.010.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.48.010 and 2004 c 266 s 14 are each amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) Before January 1, 2008:
- (a) With express authorization from the county legislative 7 authority, the county auditor may conduct all primary, special, and 8 9 general elections entirely by mail ballot. The county legislative 10 authority must give the county auditor at least ninety days' notice before the first election to be conducted entirely by mail ballot. If 11 the county legislative authority and the county auditor decide to 12 13 return to a polling place election environment, the county legislative authority must give the county auditor at least one hundred eighty 14 15 days' notice before the first election to be conducted using polling 16 places. Authorization under this subsection must apply to all primary,
- 17 special, and general elections conducted by the county auditor.
- 18 <u>(b)</u> The county auditor may designate any precinct having fewer than 19 two hundred active registered voters at the time of closing of voter

- 1 registration as provided in RCW 29A.08.140 as a mail ballot precinct.
- 2 ((The county auditor shall notify each registered voter by mail that
- 3 for all future primaries and elections the voting in his or her
- 4 precinct will be by mail ballot only.)) Authorization from the county
- 5 <u>legislative authority is not required to designate a precinct as a mail</u>
- 6 <u>ballot precinct under this subsection</u>. In determining the number of
- 7 registered voters in a precinct for the purposes of this section,
- 8 persons who are ongoing absentee voters under RCW 29A.40.040 shall not

- 23 <u>only.</u> The auditor shall mail each active voter a ballot at least 24 eighteen days before a primary, general election, or special election.
- 25 The auditor shall send each inactive voter either a ballot or an
- 26 application to receive a ballot at least eighteen days before a
- 27 primary, general election, or special election. The auditor shall
- 28 determine which of the two is to be sent. If the inactive voter
- 29 returns a voted ballot, the ballot shall be counted and the voter's
- 30 status restored to active. If the inactive voter completes and returns
- 31 an application, a ballot shall be sent and the voter's status restored
- 32 to active. The requirements regarding certification, reporting, and
- 33 the mailing of overseas and military ballots in RCW ((29.36.270))
- 34 <u>29A.40.070</u> apply to <u>elections conducted by</u> mail ballot ((precincts)).
- 35 ((If the precinct exceeds two hundred registered voters, or the
- 36 auditor determines to return to a polling place election environment,
- 37 the auditor shall notify each registered voter, by mail, of this and
- 38 shall provide the address of the polling place to be used.))
