- 1 AN ACT Relating to designating the orca as the state marine mammal;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 1.20 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that many people visit
- 5 Washington state to watch orcas, the orca is a significant symbol for
- 6 the Native American culture, there are pods of orcas that migrate
- 7 annually through Puget Sound, and the orca is easily recognizable
- 8 because of its distinct markings. The legislature intends to promote
- 9 orca awareness and to encourage protection of the natural marine
- 10 habitat by designating the orca as the official marine mammal of the
- 11 state of Washington.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 1.20 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 The orca, Orcinus orca, is hereby designated as the official marine
- 15 mammal of the state of Washington.
