1 AN ACT Relating to funding for energy freedom projects; amending
2 RCW 43.155.050; amending 2005 c 488 s 138 (uncodified); reenacting and
3 amending RCW 43.155.050; adding a new section to 2005 c 488
4 (uncodified); providing an effective date; providing an expiration
5 date; and declaring an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. 2005 c 488 s 138 (uncodified) is amended to read as
8 follows:

9 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY, TRADE, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

10 Job/Economic Development Grants (06-4-950)

11 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
12 conditions and limitations:

13 (1) The appropriation is provided solely for the following list of

17           (2) \$1,000,000 of the appropriation for the Pacific Northwest  
18 national labs campus infrastructure project is provided solely for  
19 giga-pop infrastructure.

20           ~~((3) \$5,000,000 of the appropriation for military communities  
21 infrastructure projects is provided solely for grants to support  
22 projects in Island county, Kitsap county, Pierce county, Snohomish  
23 county, and Spokane county when a military base in that county is  
24 identified for potential closure in the federal base realignment and  
25 closure process. The grants will be used to address infrastructure  
26 improvements that will aid in the removal of the base from the closure  
27 list. The office of financial management shall establish a process for  
28 selecting projects for funding based on criteria used to determine the  
29 federal base realignment and closure list and recommendations by the  
30 department of community, trade, and economic development and the  
31 military department. Final allocation of the grants shall be at the  
32 discretion and with the approval of the director of the office of  
33 financial management.))~~

15 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.155.050 and 2005 c 488 s 925 and 2005 c 425 s 4 are  
 16 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

17 (1) The public works assistance account is hereby established in  
 18 the state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works assistance  
 19 account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the legislature  
 20 or from any other lawful source. Money in the public works assistance  
 21 account shall be used to make loans and to give financial guarantees to  
 22 local governments for public works projects. Moneys in the account may  
 23 also be appropriated to provide for state match requirements under  
 24 federal law for projects and activities conducted and financed by the  
 25 board under the drinking water assistance account. Not more than  
 26 fifteen percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation to the  
 27 public works board from this account may be expended or obligated for  
 28 preconstruction loans, emergency loans, or loans for capital facility  
 29 planning under this chapter; of this amount, not more than ten percent  
 30 of the biennial capital budget appropriation may be expended for  
 31 emergency loans and not more than one percent of the biennial capital  
 32 budget appropriation may be expended for capital facility planning  
 33 loans. For the 2005-2007 biennium, moneys in the account may be used  
 34 for grants for projects identified in section 138, chapter 488, Laws of  
 35 2005 and for projects identified in section 2 of this act.

1 (2) The job development fund is hereby established in the state  
2 treasury. Up to fifty million dollars each biennium from the public  
3 works assistance account may be transferred into the job development  
4 fund. Money in the job development fund may be used solely for job  
5 development fund program grants, administrative expenses related to the  
6 administration of the job development fund program created in RCW  
7 43.160.230, and for the report prepared by the joint legislative audit  
8 and review committee pursuant to RCW 44.28.801(2). Moneys in the job  
9 development fund may be spent only after appropriation. The board  
10 shall prepare a prioritized list of proposed projects of up to fifty  
11 million dollars as part of the department's 2007-09 biennial budget  
12 request. The board may provide an additional alternate job development  
13 fund project list of up to ten million dollars. The legislature may  
14 remove projects from the list recommended by the board. The  
15 legislature may not change the prioritization of projects recommended  
16 for funding by the board, but may add projects from the alternate list  
17 in order of priority, as long as the total funding does not exceed  
18 fifty million dollars.

19 **Sec. 4.** RCW 43.155.050 and 2005 c 488 s 925 are each amended to  
20 read as follows:

21 The public works assistance account is hereby established in the  
22 state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works assistance  
23 account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the legislature  
24 or from any other lawful source. Money in the public works assistance  
25 account shall be used to make loans and to give financial guarantees to  
26 local governments for public works projects. Moneys in the account may  
27 also be appropriated to provide for state match requirements under  
28 federal law for projects and activities conducted and financed by the  
29 board under the drinking water assistance account. Not more than  
30 fifteen percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation to the  
31 public works board from this account may be expended or obligated for  
32 preconstruction loans, emergency loans, or loans for capital facility  
33 planning under this chapter; of this amount, not more than ten percent  
34 of the biennial capital budget appropriation may be expended for  
35 emergency loans and not more than one percent of the biennial capital  
36 budget appropriation may be expended for capital facility planning

1 loans. For the 2005-2007 biennium, moneys in the account may be used  
2 for grants for projects identified in section 138, chapter 488, Laws of  
3 2005 and for projects identified in section 2 of this act.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** Section 3 of this act expires June 30, 2011.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** Section 4 of this act takes effect June 30,  
6 2011.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** This act is necessary for the immediate  
8 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
9 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
10 immediately.

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
