1 AN ACT Relating to training regarding the use of force and physical
2 restraints for school building administrators and other school security
3 personnel; adding a new section to chapter 28A.300 RCW; and adding a
4 new section to chapter 43.43 RCW.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
7 RCW to read as follows:

8 (1) By December 30, 2005, the superintendent of public instruction
9 in collaboration with the Washington state school safety center
10 advisory committee, and in consultation with the criminal justice
11 training commission, shall develop a model policy and training
12 standards for school building administrators and other school security
13 personnel relative to the use of force and physical restraint in the
14 common schools. The superintendent of public instruction shall report
15 to the appropriate committees of the legislature regarding the model
16 policy and training standards for school building administrators and
17 other school security personnel relative to the use of force and
18 physical restraint.

1 (2) By March 30, 2006, the model policy and training standards
2 developed under this section shall be made available to serve as
3 guidance to school districts and educational service districts and
4 shall be posted on the superintendent of public instruction's web site.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.43 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 By June 1, 2006, the criminal justice training commission, in
8 cooperation with the superintendent of public instruction and the
9 Washington state school safety center advisory committee, shall develop
10 training materials in support of the model policy on the use of force
11 and physical restraint.

12 Training on use of force and physical restraint shall be included
13 in the current training provided by the criminal justice training
14 commission as approved by, and in cooperation with, the superintendent
15 of public instruction with the advice of the Washington state school
16 safety center advisory committee for school administrators and school
17 safety personnel.
