- AN ACT Relating to financial literacy education; adding a new section to chapter 28A.230 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that the purpose 4 5 of the state's public education system is to help students acquire the skills and knowledge they need to be informed, productive, and 6 responsible citizens. The legislature also recognizes that a lack of 7 8 financial literacy can pose a significant barrier for individuals 9 seeking to achieve financial prosperity and life-long stability. 10 legislature finds that it is of the utmost importance to ensure that Washington's students are educated in financial matters in order to 11 12 prepare them for financial independence and help them develop the 13 fiscal responsibility and financial management skills necessary to have 14 a secure future and succeed in the twenty-first century.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.230 RCW to read as follows:
- 17 (1) Each school district board of directors is encouraged to adopt

a financial literacy education program that is integrated within the existing curriculum.
