
SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6291

1 AN ACT Relating to a cosmetology licensing exemption; and amending
2 RCW 18.16.060.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.16.060 and 2004 c 51 s 1 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) It is unlawful for any person to engage in a practice listed in
7 subsection (2) of this section unless the person has a license in good
8 standing as required by this chapter. A license issued under this
9 chapter shall be considered to be "in good standing" except when: (a)
10 The license has expired or has been canceled and has not been renewed
11 in accordance with RCW 18.16.110; (b) the license has been denied,
12 revoked, or suspended under RCW 18.16.210, 18.16.230, or 18.16.240, and
13 has not been reinstated; (c) the license is held by a person who has
14 not fully complied with an order of the director issued under RCW
15 18.16.210 requiring the licensee to pay restitution or a fine, or to
16 acquire additional training; or (d) the license has been placed on
17 inactive status at the request of the licensee, and has not been
18 reinstated in accordance with RCW 18.16.110(3).

1 (2) The director may take action under RCW 18.235.150 and
2 18.235.160 against any person who does any of the following without
3 first obtaining, and maintaining in good standing, the license required
4 by this chapter:

5 (a) Except as provided in subsection (3) or (4) of this section,
6 engages in the commercial practice of cosmetology, barbering,
7 esthetics, or manicuring;

8 (b) Instructs in a school;

9 (c) Operates a school; or

10 (d) Operates a salon/shop, personal services, or mobile unit.

11 (3) A person who receives a license as an instructor may engage in
12 the commercial practice for which he or she held a license when
13 applying for the instructor license without also renewing the
14 previously held license. However, a person licensed as an instructor
15 whose license to engage in a commercial practice is not or at any time
16 was not renewed may not engage in the commercial practice previously
17 permitted under that license unless that person renews the previously
18 held license.

19 (4) A person is not engaged in the commercial practice of
20 cosmetology, barbering, esthetics, or manicuring if the person is not
21 otherwise required to be licensed under this chapter, and:

22 (a) Is a volunteer with, or employee of, a professional
23 photographer or an entity engaged in the production of theatrical,
24 musical, film, video, or television performances; and

25 (b) In the course of such volunteer work or employment, applies
26 makeup to, or arranges and prepares hair of, another person in
27 preparation for the person to be professionally photographed or appear
28 in a theatrical, musical, film, video, or television performance or
29 production.
