
SENATE BILL 6312

State of Washington 59th Legislature 2006 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to restricting the solicitation of money or
2 employment from the side of a public highway; reenacting and amending
3 RCW 46.63.020; adding a new section to chapter 46.61 RCW; creating a
4 new section; and prescribing penalties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that persons
7 attempting to solicit employment or contributions from the occupants of
8 moving or idle vehicles on public highways is unsafe for both the
9 person engaging in the solicitation and for traffic in general. The
10 activity of soliciting employment or contributions from the occupants
11 of vehicles distracts drivers from their primary duty to watch traffic
12 and be alert for potential hazards in the roadway, to observe all
13 traffic control signals, signs, or warnings, and to be prepared to move
14 through intersections. Distracted drivers are more prone to be
15 involved in automobile accidents, and accidents on public highways
16 constitute a substantial traffic safety problem. The cumulative impact
17 of this type of activity on public highways on a daily basis creates a
18 potential safety hazard, which poses a significant and substantial risk
19 to the interest of the public in the free flow of travel.

1 Additionally, the activity of soliciting employment or
2 contributions from the occupants of vehicles also constitutes an
3 impediment to the normal and safe flow of traffic on our public
4 highways. The practice of soliciting employment or contributions on or
5 next to a public highway subjects the solicitor and vehicles to an
6 unacceptable level of danger by distracting drivers from their primary
7 duty to watch traffic, results in the delay and obstruction of the
8 public's free flow of travel, and causes congestion and blockage of
9 public highways and its intersections when such persons approach the
10 vehicles to negotiate with the occupants.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.61 RCW
12 to read as follows:

13 (1) No person shall stand or sit on a public highway, nor upon any
14 shoulder or intersection control area of a public highway, for the
15 purpose of soliciting employment or contributions from the occupant of
16 any vehicle while such vehicle is operating on the respective public
17 highway, shoulder, or intersection control area.

18 (2) For the purposes of this section, the following definitions
19 apply:

20 (a) "Soliciting" means asking for money, objects of value, or
21 employment, with the intention that the money or object be transferred
22 or the employment offered at that time and at that place. "Soliciting"
23 includes, but is not limited to, using the spoken, written, or printed
24 word, bodily gestures, signs, or other means with the purpose of
25 obtaining an immediate donation of money or other thing of value or
26 soliciting the sale of goods or services.

27 (b) "Public highway" means the entire width between the boundary
28 lines of every way publicly maintained when any part is open to the use
29 of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.

30 (c) "Intersection control area" means an intersection area,
31 together with any modification of the adjacent roadway area as results
32 from the arc of curb corners and together with any marked or unmarked
33 crosswalks adjacent to the intersection.

34 (3) A violation of this section constitutes a misdemeanor.

35 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.63.020 and 2005 c 431 s 2, 2005 c 323 s 3, and 2005
36 c 183 s 10 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

1 Failure to perform any act required or the performance of any act
2 prohibited by this title or an equivalent administrative regulation or
3 local law, ordinance, regulation, or resolution relating to traffic
4 including parking, standing, stopping, and pedestrian offenses, is
5 designated as a traffic infraction and may not be classified as a
6 criminal offense, except for an offense contained in the following
7 provisions of this title or a violation of an equivalent administrative
