1 AN ACT Relating to voter registration; amending RCW 29A.04.103,
2 29A.04.109, 29A.04.163, 29A.08.010, 29A.08.110, 46.20.155, 29A.08.140,
3 29A.08.210, 29A.08.220, 29A.08.520, 29A.08.651, and 29A.84.110;
4 reenacting and amending RCW 9.94A.515; adding new sections to chapter
5 29A.08 RCW; adding new sections to chapter 29A.84 RCW; repealing RCW
6 29A.08.145 and 29A.84.670; and prescribing penalties.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.04.103 and 2003 c 111 s 118 are each amended to
9 read as follows:

10 "Out-of-state voter" means any (~~elector~~) registered voter of the
11 state of Washington outside the state but not outside the territorial
12 limits of the United States or the District of Columbia.

13 **Sec. 2.** RCW 29A.04.109 and 2003 c 111 s 119 are each amended to
14 read as follows:

15 "Overseas voter" means any (~~elector~~) registered voter of the
16 state of Washington outside the territorial limits of the United States
17 or the District of Columbia.

1 **Sec. 3.** RCW 29A.04.163 and 2003 c 111 s 127 are each amended to
2 read as follows:

3 "Service voter" means any (~~elector~~) registered voter of the state
4 of Washington who is a member of the armed forces under 42 U.S.C. Sec.
5 1973 ff-6 while in active service, is a student or member of the
6 faculty at a United States military academy, is a member of the
7 merchant marine of the United States, is a program participant as
8 defined in RCW 40.24.020, or is a member of a religious group or
9 welfare agency officially attached to and serving with the armed forces
10 of the United States.

11 **Sec. 4.** RCW 29A.08.010 and 2005 c 246 s 2 are each amended to read
12 as follows:

13 As used in this chapter: "Information required for voter
14 registration" or "required information" means the minimum information
15 provided on a voter registration application that is required by the
16 county auditor in order to place a voter registration applicant on the
17 voter registration rolls. This information includes:

18 (1) Name;

19 (2) Residential address;

20 (3) Date of birth and proof that the applicant will be over
21 eighteen at the next election;

22 (4) Washington state driver's license number or Washington state
23 identification card number, or the last four digits of the applicant's
24 Social Security number if the applicant does not have a Washington
25 state driver's license or Washington state identification card;

26 (5) A signature attesting to the truth of the information provided
27 on the application; and

28 (6) (~~A check or indication in the box confirming the individual~~)
29 Proof that the applicant is a United States citizen.

30 If the individual does not have a driver's license, state
31 identification card, or Social Security number, the registrant must be
32 issued a unique voter registration number in order to be placed on the
33 voter registration rolls. All other information supplied is ancillary
34 and not to be used as grounds for not registering an applicant to vote.
35 Modification of the language of the official Washington state voter
36 registration form by the voter will not be accepted and will cause the

1 rejection of the registrant's application. Proof of citizenship is not
2 required if an applicant is transferring his or her voter registration
3 within a county or between counties in this state.

4 **Sec. 5.** RCW 29A.08.110 and 2005 c 246 s 5 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) An application is considered complete only if it contains the
7 applicant's name, complete valid residence address, date of birth and
8 proof that the applicant will be over eighteen at the next election,
9 signature attesting to the truth of the information provided, (~~a mark~~
10 ~~in the check-off box confirming United States citizenship~~) proof that
11 the applicant is a United States citizen, and an indication that the
12 provided driver's license number, state identification card number, or
13 Social Security number has been confirmed by the secretary of state.
14 Proof of citizenship is not required if an applicant is transferring
15 his or her voter registration within a county or between counties in
16 this state. If it is not complete, the auditor shall promptly mail a
17 verification notice of the deficiency to the applicant. This
18 verification notice shall require the applicant to provide the missing
19 information. If the verification notice is not returned by the
20 applicant within forty-five days or is returned as undeliverable, the
21 name of the applicant shall not be placed on the official list of
22 registered voters. If the applicant provides the required verified
23 information, the applicant shall be registered to vote as of the
24 original date of mailing or date of delivery, whichever is applicable.

25 (2) If the information required in subsection (1) of this section
26 is complete, the applicant is considered to be registered to vote as of
27 the original date of mailing or date of delivery, whichever is
28 applicable. The auditor shall record the appropriate precinct
29 identification, taxing district identification, and date of
30 registration on the voter's record in the state voter registration
31 list. Within forty-five days after the receipt of an application but
32 no later than seven days before the next primary, special election, or
33 general election, the auditor shall send to the applicant, by first
34 class mail, an acknowledgement notice identifying the registrant's
35 precinct and containing such other information as may be required by
36 the secretary of state. The postal service shall be instructed not to

1 forward a voter registration card to any other address and to return to
2 the auditor any card which is not deliverable.

3 (3) If an acknowledgement notice card is properly mailed as
4 required by this section to the address listed by the voter as being
5 the voter's mailing address and the notice is subsequently returned to
6 the auditor by the postal service as being undeliverable to the voter
7 at that address, the auditor shall promptly send the voter a
8 confirmation notice. The auditor shall place the voter's registration
9 on inactive status pending a response from the voter to the
10 confirmation notice.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW
12 to read as follows:

13 A person may prove that he or she is a United States citizen with
14 an original or copy of any one of the following:

- 15 (1) A United States passport;
16 (2) A certified birth certificate issued by the city, county, or
17 state. A certified birth certificate has a registrar's raised,
18 embossed, impressed, or multicolored seal, registrar's signature, and
19 the date the certificate was filed with the registrar's office, which
20 must be within one year of birth;
21 (3) A consular report of birth abroad or certification of birth;
22 (4) A naturalization certificate; or
23 (5) A certificate of citizenship.

24 **Sec. 7.** RCW 46.20.155 and 2005 c 246 s 24 are each amended to read
25 as follows:

26 (1) Before issuing an original license or identicard or renewing a
27 license or identicard under this chapter, the licensing agent shall
28 determine if the applicant wants to register to vote or transfer his or
29 her voter registration by asking the following question:

30 "Do you want to register to vote or transfer your voter
31 registration?"

32 If the applicant chooses to register or transfer a registration,
33 the agent shall make the following statement and ask the applicant the
34 following questions:

1 (1) "You must be a United States citizen and at least eighteen
2 years of age in order to vote."

3 (2) "Are you a United States citizen?"

4 (~~(+2)~~) (3) "Are you or will you be eighteen years of age on or
5 before the next election?"

6 If the applicant answers in the affirmative to both questions, the
7 agent shall then provide the applicant with a voter registration form
8 and instructions and shall record that the applicant has requested to
9 register to vote or transfer a voter registration. If the applicant
10 answers in the negative to either question, the agent shall not provide
11 the applicant with a voter registration form.

12 (2) The department shall establish a procedure that substantially
13 meets the requirements of subsection (1) of this section when
14 permitting an applicant to renew a license or identicard by mail or by
15 electronic commerce.

16 **Sec. 8.** RCW 29A.08.140 and 2004 c 267 s 112 are each amended to
17 read as follows:

18 The registration files of all precincts shall be closed against
19 original registration or transfers for thirty days immediately
20 preceding every primary, special election, and general election to be
21 held in such precincts.

22 The county auditor shall give notice of the closing of the precinct
23 files for original registration and transfer ~~((and notice of the~~
24 ~~special registration and voting procedure provided by RCW 29A.08.145))~~
25 by one publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county
26 at least five days before the closing of the precinct files.

27 No person may vote at any primary, special election, or general
28 election in a precinct polling place unless he or she has registered to
29 vote at least thirty days before that primary or election and appears
30 on the official statewide voter registration list. ~~((If a person,~~
31 ~~otherwise qualified to vote in the state, county, and precinct in which~~
32 ~~he or she applies for registration, does not register at least thirty~~
33 ~~days before any primary, special election, or general election, he or~~
34 ~~she may register and vote by absentee ballot for that primary or~~
35 ~~election under RCW 29A.08.145.))~~

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 9.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW
2 to read as follows:

3 In order to vote at any election or primary, whether at a polling
4 place or by absentee or mail ballot, a person must have registered to
5 vote at least thirty days before the election or primary, regardless of
6 the person's status as an absentee, mail ballot, out-of-state,
7 overseas, or service voter.

8 **Sec. 10.** RCW 29A.08.210 and 2005 c 246 s 11 are each amended to
9 read as follows:

10 An applicant for voter registration shall complete an application
11 providing the following information concerning his or her
12 qualifications as a voter in this state:

13 (1) The address of the last former registration of the applicant as
14 a voter in the state;

15 (2) The applicant's full name;

16 (3) The applicant's date of birth;

17 (4) The address of the applicant's residence for voting purposes;

18 (5) The mailing address of the applicant if that address is not the
19 same as the address in subsection (4) of this section;

20 (6) The sex of the applicant;

21 (7) The applicant's Washington state driver's license number or
22 Washington state identification card number, or the last four digits of
23 the applicant's Social Security number if he or she does not have a
24 Washington state driver's license or Washington state identification
25 card;

26 (8) A check box for the applicant to indicate that he or she does
27 not have a Washington state driver's license, Washington state
28 identification card, or Social Security number;

29 (9) A check box allowing the applicant to indicate that he or she
30 is a member of the armed forces, national guard, or reserves, or that
31 he or she is an overseas voter;

32 (10) (~~(A check box allowing the applicant to confirm)~~) Proof that
33 he or she is at least eighteen years of age;

34 (11) Clear and conspicuous language, designed to draw the
35 applicant's attention, stating that the applicant must be a United
36 States citizen in order to register to vote;

1 (12) (~~(A check box and declaration confirming)~~) Proof that the
2 applicant is a citizen of the United States;

3 (13) The following warning:

4 "If you knowingly provide false information on this voter
5 registration form or knowingly make a false declaration about your
6 qualifications for voter registration you will have committed a class
7 C felony that is punishable by imprisonment for up to five years, a
8 fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both."

9 (14) The following affirmation by the applicant:

10 "By signing this document, I hereby assert, under penalty of
11 perjury, that I am legally eligible to vote. If I am found to have
12 voted illegally, I may be prosecuted and/or fined for this illegal act.
13 In addition, I hereby acknowledge that my name and last known address
14 will be forwarded to the appropriate state and/or federal authorities
15 if I am found to have voted illegally."

16 (15) The oath required by RCW 29A.08.230 and a space for the
17 applicant's signature; and

18 (16) Any other information that the secretary of state determines
19 is necessary to establish the identity of the applicant and prevent
20 duplicate or fraudulent voter registrations.

21 This information shall be recorded on a single registration form to
22 be prescribed by the secretary of state.

23 If the applicant fails to provide the information required for
24 voter registration, the auditor shall send the applicant a verification
25 notice. The applicant may not be registered until the required
26 information is provided. If a verification notice is returned as
27 undeliverable or the applicant fails to respond to the notice within
28 forty-five days, the applicant shall not be registered to vote.

29 **Sec. 11.** RCW 29A.08.220 and 2004 c 267 s 115 are each amended to
30 read as follows:

31 (1) The secretary of state shall specify by rule the format of all
32 voter registration applications. These applications shall be
33 compatible with existing voter registration records. An applicant for
34 voter registration shall be required to complete only one application
35 and to provide the required information other than his or her signature
36 no more than one time. If an applicant transfers his or her voter
37 registration within a county or between counties of this state, he or

1 she is not required to provide proof of citizenship. These
2 applications shall also contain information for the voter to transfer
3 his or her registration.

4 Any application format specified by the secretary for use in
5 registering to vote in state and local elections shall satisfy the
6 requirements of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-
7 31) and the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (P.L. 107-252) for
8 registering to vote in federal elections.

9 (2) All registration applications required under RCW 29A.08.210 and
10 29A.08.340 shall be produced and furnished by the secretary of state to
11 the county auditors and the department of licensing.

12 **Sec. 12.** RCW 29A.08.520 and 2005 c 246 s 15 are each amended to
13 read as follows:

14 (1) Upon receiving official notice of a person's conviction of a
15 felony in either state or federal court, if the convicted person is a
16 registered voter in the county, the county auditor shall cancel the
17 defendant's voter registration. Additionally, the secretary of state
18 in conjunction with the department of corrections, the Washington state
19 patrol, the office of the administrator for the courts, and other
20 appropriate state agencies shall arrange for a (~~quarterly~~) monthly
21 comparison of a list of known felons with the statewide voter
22 registration list. If a person is found on a felon list and the
23 statewide voter registration list, the secretary of state or county
24 auditor shall confirm the match through a date of birth comparison and
25 immediately suspend the voter registration from the official state
26 voter registration list. The canceling authority shall send to the
27 person at his or her last known voter registration address a notice of
28 the proposed cancellation and an explanation of the requirements for
29 restoring the right to vote once all terms of sentencing have been
30 completed. If the person does not respond within thirty days, the
31 registration must be canceled.

32 (2) The right to vote may be restored by, for each felony
33 conviction, one of the following:

34 (a) A certificate of discharge issued by the sentencing court, as
35 provided in RCW 9.94A.637;

36 (b) A court order restoring the right, as provided in RCW 9.92.066;

1 (c) A final order of discharge issued by the indeterminate sentence
2 review board, as provided in RCW 9.96.050; or

3 (d) A certificate of restoration issued by the governor, as
4 provided in RCW 9.96.020.

5 (3) Felons who have been granted a certificate of discharge by a
6 court shall provide a certified copy of the certificate of discharge to
7 the department of corrections and the Washington state patrol within
8 thirty days from the day the court grants the certificate, and shall
9 provide a certified copy of their certificate of discharge to the
10 elections officer at the time they register to vote.

11 **Sec. 13.** RCW 29A.08.651 and 2005 c 246 s 16 are each amended to
12 read as follows:

13 (1) The office of the secretary of state shall create and maintain
14 a statewide voter registration data base. This data base must be a
15 single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive computerized
16 statewide voter registration list defined, maintained, and administered
17 at the state level that contains the name and registration information
18 of every legally registered voter in the state and assigns a unique
19 identifier to each legally registered voter in the state.

20 (2) The computerized list must serve as the single system for
21 storing and maintaining the official list of registered voters
22 throughout the state.

23 (3) The computerized list must contain the name and registration
24 information of every legally registered voter in the state.

25 (4) Under the computerized list, a unique identifier is assigned to
26 each legally registered voter in the state.

27 (5) The computerized list must be coordinated with other agency
28 data bases within the state, including but not limited to the
29 department of corrections, the department of licensing, the department
30 of health, the Washington state patrol, and the office of the
31 administrator for the courts. The computerized list may also be
32 coordinated with the data bases of election officials in other states.

33 (6) Any election officer in the state, including any local election
34 officer, may obtain immediate electronic access to the information
35 contained in the computerized list.

36 (7) All voter registration information obtained by any local

1 election officer in the state must be electronically entered into the
2 computerized list on an expedited basis at the time the information is
3 provided to the local officer.

4 (8) The chief state election officer shall provide support, as may
5 be required, so that local election officers are able to enter
6 information as described in subsection (3) of this section.

7 (9) The computerized list serves as the official voter registration
8 list for the conduct of all elections.

9 (10) The secretary of state has data authority on all voter
10 registration data.

11 (11) The voter registration data base must be designed to
12 accomplish at a minimum, the following:

13 (a) Comply with the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (P.L. 107-252);

14 (b) Identify duplicate voter registrations;

15 (c) Identify suspected duplicate voters;

16 (d) Screen against the department of corrections, the Washington
17 state patrol, and other appropriate state agency data bases to aid in
18 the cancellation of voter registration of felons, of persons who have
19 declined to serve on juries by virtue of not being citizens of the
20 United States, and of persons determined to be legally incompetent to
21 vote;

22 (e) Provide up-to-date signatures of voters for the purposes of
23 initiative signature checking;

24 (f) Provide for a comparison between the voter registration data
25 base and the department of licensing change of address data base;

26 (g) Provide online access for county auditors with the goal of real
27 time duplicate checking and update capabilities; and

28 (h) Provide for the cancellation of voter registration for persons
29 who have moved to other states and surrendered their Washington state
30 drivers' licenses.

31 (12) In order to maintain the statewide voter registration data
32 base, the secretary of state may, upon agreement with other appropriate
33 jurisdictions, screen against data bases maintained by election
34 officials in other states and data bases maintained by federal agencies
35 including, but not limited to, the federal bureau of investigation, the
36 federal court system, the federal bureau of prisons, and the bureau of
37 citizenship and immigration services.

1 (13) The secretary of state shall retain information regarding
2 previous successful appeals of proposed cancellations of registrations
3 in order to avoid repeated cancellations for the same reason.

4 (14) The secretary of state must review and update the records of
5 all registered voters on the computerized list on a ~~((quarterly))~~
6 monthly basis to make additions and corrections.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 14.** A new section is added to chapter 29A.84
8 RCW to read as follows:

9 The secretary of state and the appropriate county auditor shall
10 refer all cases of violations of the following statutes that they
11 discover or suspect to have occurred to the local prosecuting attorney:
12 RCW 29A.84.130, 29A.84.140, 29A.84.650, 29A.84.655, 29A.84.660, and
13 29A.84.680, and section 16 of this act. The prosecutor to whom the
14 violations were referred shall submit to the secretary of state a list
15 of all such referrals, the basis of the referrals, and the final
16 disposition of the referrals.

17 **Sec. 15.** RCW 29A.84.110 and 2003 c 111 s 2105 are each amended to
18 read as follows:

19 If any county auditor or registration assistant:

20 (1) Willfully neglects or refuses to perform any duty required by
21 law in connection with the registration of voters; or

22 (2) Willfully neglects or refuses to perform such duty in the
23 manner required by voter registration law; or

24 (3) Enters or causes or permits to be entered on the voter
25 registration records the name of any person in any other manner or at
26 any other time than as prescribed by voter registration law or enters
27 or causes or permits to be entered on such records the name of any
28 person not entitled to be thereon; or

29 (4) Destroys, mutilates, conceals, changes, or alters any
30 registration record in connection therewith except as authorized by
31 voter registration law,

32 he or she is guilty of a ~~((gross misdemeanor punishable to the same
33 extent as a gross misdemeanor that is punishable under RCW 9A.20.021))~~
34 class C felony.
