10 until the office of financial management has approved the allotment of  
11 the funds to be expended. The office of financial management shall  
12 encourage state agencies to incorporate accessibility planning and  
13 improvements into the normal and customary capital program.

14 (4) It is generally not intended to make future appropriations for  
15 capital expenditures or for maintenance and operating expenses for an  
16 acquisition project or a significant expansion project that is  
17 initiated through the minor works process and therefore does not  
18 receive a policy and fiscal analysis by the legislature. Minor works

14 contract in an amount not to exceed \$4,800,000 plus financing expenses
