1 AN ACT Relating to record checks for employees and applicants for
2 employment at bureau of Indian affairs-funded schools; and amending RCW
3 28A.400.303 and 28A.400.305.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.400.303 and 2001 c 296 s 3 are each amended to
6 read as follows:

7 (1) School districts, educational service districts, the state
8 school for the deaf, the state school for the blind, and their
9 contractors hiring employees who will have regularly scheduled
10 unsupervised access to children shall require a record check through
11 the Washington state patrol criminal identification system under RCW
12 43.43.830 through 43.43.834, 10.97.030, and 10.97.050 and through the
13 federal bureau of investigation before hiring an employee. The record
14 check shall include a fingerprint check using a complete Washington
15 state criminal identification fingerprint card. The requesting entity
16 shall provide a copy of the record report to the applicant. When
17 necessary, applicants may be employed on a conditional basis pending
18 completion of the investigation. If the applicant has had a record
19 check within the previous two years, the district, the state school for

1 the deaf, the state school for the blind, or contractor may waive the
2 requirement. Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the
3 district, pursuant to chapter 41.59 or 41.56 RCW, the state school for
4 the deaf, the state school for the blind, or contractor hiring the
5 employee shall determine who shall pay costs associated with the record
6 check.

7 (2) Employees and applicants for employment of federal bureau of
8 Indian affairs-funded schools may use the process in subsection (1) of
9 this section for record checks. Any costs incurred under this
10 subsection shall be borne by the requesting entity.

11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.400.305 and 2001 c 296 s 4 are each amended to
12 read as follows:

13 The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules as
14 necessary under chapter 34.05 RCW on record check information. The
15 rules shall include, but not be limited to the following:

16 (1) Written procedures providing a school district, state school
17 for the deaf, ~~((or))~~ state school for the blind, or federal bureau of
18 Indian affairs-funded school employee or applicant for certification or
19 employment access to and review of information obtained based on the
20 record check required under RCW 28A.400.303; and

21 (2) Written procedures limiting access to the superintendent of
22 public instruction record check data base to only those individuals
23 processing record check information at the office of the superintendent
24 of public instruction, the appropriate school district or districts,
25 the state school for the deaf, the state school for the blind, ~~((and))~~
26 the appropriate educational service district or districts, and the
27 appropriate federal bureau of Indian affairs-funded schools.

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
