

SHB 1527 - H AMD 1066

1 On page 1, at the beginning of line 6, insert the following:

2 "**Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.40.091 and 2005 c 246 s 21 are each amended
3 to read as follows:

4 The county auditor shall send each absentee voter a ballot, a
5 security envelope in which to seal the ballot after voting, a
6 larger envelope in which to return the security envelope, and
7 instructions on how to mark the ballot and how to return it to the
8 county auditor. The instructions that accompany an absentee ballot
9 for a partisan primary must include instructions for voting the
10 applicable ballot style, as provided in chapter 29A.36 RCW. The
11 absentee voter's name and address must be printed on the larger
12 return envelope, which must also contain a declaration by the
13 absentee voter reciting his or her qualifications and stating that
14 he or she has not voted in any other jurisdiction at this election,
15 together with a summary of the penalties for any violation of any
16 of the provisions of this chapter. The declaration must clearly
17 inform the voter that it is illegal to vote if he or she is not a
18 United States citizen; it is illegal to vote if he or she has been
19 convicted of a felony and has not had his or her voting rights
20 restored; and, except as otherwise provided by law, it is illegal
21 to cast a ballot or sign an absentee envelope on behalf of another
22 voter. The return envelope must provide space for the voter to
23 indicate the date on which the ballot was voted and for the voter
24 to sign the oath. It must also contain a space so that the voter
25 may include a telephone number. A summary of the applicable
26 penalty provisions of this chapter must be printed on the return
27 envelope immediately adjacent to the space for the voter's
28 signature. The signature of the voter on the return envelope must
29 affirm and attest to the statements regarding the qualifications of
30 that voter and to the validity of the ballot. The return envelope

1 must also have a secrecy flap that the voter may seal that will
2 cover the voter's signature and optional telephone number. For
3 out-of-state voters, overseas voters, and service voters, the
4 signed declaration on the return envelope constitutes the
5 equivalent of a voter registration for the election or primary for
6 which the ballot has been issued. The voter must be instructed to
7 either return the ballot to the county auditor by whom it was
8 issued or attach sufficient first-class postage, if applicable, and
9 mail the ballot to the appropriate county auditor no later than the
10 day of the election or primary for which the ballot was issued.

11 ~~((If the county auditor chooses to forward absentee ballots, he
12 or she must include with the ballot a clear explanation of the
13 qualifications necessary to vote in that election and must also
14 advise a voter with questions about his or her eligibility to
15 contact the county auditor. This explanation may be provided on
16 the ballot envelope, on an enclosed insert, or printed directly on
17 the ballot itself. If the information is not included, the
18 envelope must clearly indicate that the ballot is not to be
19 forwarded and that return postage is guaranteed)) Absentee ballots
20 may not be forwarded. The ballot envelope must clearly indicate
21 that the ballot may not be forwarded and should be returned to the
22 county auditor with return postage guaranteed if the voter is no
23 longer at the address provided for the absentee ballot."~~

EFFECT: Prohibits the forwarding of absentee ballots.
