

**2SSB 6227 - H AMD 1574**

**SCOPE AND OBJECT 3/12/2008**

1           On page 3, after line 28, insert the following:

2           "(4)(a) As part of its administrator duties, the department of  
3 fish and wildlife must conduct a study as to the effectiveness of  
4 the existing hydraulic project approval process under chapter 77.55  
5 RCW in helping marine resource committees protect fish life.

6           (b) The study required by this section must consider the  
7 effectiveness of legislative enactments, the actual implementation  
8 of those enactments by the department of fish and wildlife, the  
9 benefits the hydraulic approval process has on marine resources  
10 committees, and the impact that historic funding levels for the  
11 program have on the effectiveness of the program. The study must  
12 focus on both the level of compliance with chapter 77.55 RCW and on  
13 the final degree of fish life protection that is achieved even in  
14 instances of full compliance.

15           (c) Prior to the final release of the study required by this  
16 section, a majority of the members of the fish and wildlife  
17 commission must vote to affirm that the study has been fully  
18 completed.

19           (d) The requirements of this section must be completed as  
20 readily as funds allow, while still allowing a full and complete  
21 study. To satisfy this section, the department of fish and wildlife  
22 may use any funds appropriated to it for this specific purpose, any  
23 available nondesignated funds in control of the department of fish  
24 and wildlife, and any private donations provided to the department  
25 of fish and wildlife for the purposes of this section.

26           (e) The department of fish and wildlife may not, within an area  
27 designated as an aquatic reserve by the commissioner of public  
28 lands, approve or renew any approvals under chapter 77.55 RCW for  
29 any commercial, industrial, or barge loading facilities that may  
30 accommodate the removal of sand and gravel until the study required

1 by this section is completed. In addition, any approvals issued or  
2 renewed by the department of fish and wildlife under chapter 77.55  
3 RCW for any project impacting land described in this subsection  
4 after June 30, 2007, that are under appeal as of the effective date  
5 of this section may not be advanced to a final decision that allows  
6 the permitted project to begin construction until the requirements  
7 of this section are completed."

**EFFECT:** Requires the Department of Fish and Wildlife to study how the hydraulics approval process benefits marine resources committees and limits the final issuance of certain permits until the study is complete.
