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EFFECT: Eliminates the funding for the City of Everett minor league baseball - Aquasox (\$433,000), City of Kent Event center (\$3,000,000), City of Spokane minor league baseball - Indians (\$2,000,000), City of Tacoma minor league baseball - Rainiers (\$2,500,000), City of Yakima minor league baseball (\$433,000) and Tri-Cities minor league baseball (\$666,000) and provides \$9.032 million for the Department of Community, Trade and Economic Development to distribute as grants to local governments to add capacity to local jails. The Department of Corrections and the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs will develop criteria for allocating the funds to local governments.
