Background:

The State Health Care Authority (HCA) is the state agency which administers state employee insurance benefits and the Basic Health Plan, which is a state subsidized health insurance program for low income people. The HCA's authority includes the ability to apply for, receive, and accept grants to implement initiatives and strategies.

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not a part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

Summary of Bill:

It is specified that the primary duties of the HCA includes administering grants that further its mission and goals. The HCA may issue, distribute, and administer such grants.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Available.

Effective Date: The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.
