1            AN ACT Relating to disorderly conduct; amending RCW 9A.84.030;  
2            prescribing penalties; and declaring an emergency.

3            BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.84.030 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 260 s 9A.84.030 are  
5            each amended to read as follows:

6            (1) A person is guilty of disorderly conduct if (~~he~~) the person:

7            (a) Uses abusive language and thereby intentionally creates a risk  
8            of assault; (~~or~~)

9            (b) Intentionally disrupts any lawful assembly or meeting of  
10           persons without lawful authority; (~~or~~)

11           (c) Intentionally obstructs vehicular or pedestrian traffic without  
12           lawful authority; or

13           (d)(i) Intentionally engages in fighting or in tumultuous conduct  
14           or makes unreasonable noise, within five hundred feet of:

15           (A) The location where a funeral or burial is being performed;

16           (B) A funeral home during the viewing of a deceased person;

17           (C) A funeral procession, if the person described in this  
18           subsection (1)(d) knows that the funeral procession is taking place; or

1        (D) A building in which a funeral or memorial service is being  
2 conducted; and

3        (ii) Knows that the activity adversely affects the funeral, burial,  
4 viewing, funeral procession, or memorial service.

5        (2) Disorderly conduct is a misdemeanor.

6        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate  
7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
8 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
9 immediately.
