
SENATE BILL 6913

State of Washington 60th Legislature 2008 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to increasing the membership of public
2 transportation benefit area authorities; and amending RCW 36.57A.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.57A.050 and 2007 c 469 s 14 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 Within sixty days of the establishment of the boundaries of the
7 public transportation benefit area the members of the county
8 legislative authority and the elected representative of each city
9 within the area shall provide for the selection of the governing body
10 of such area, the public transportation benefit area authority, which
11 shall consist of elected officials selected by and serving at the
12 pleasure of the governing bodies of component cities within the area
13 and the county legislative authority of each county within the area.
14 If at the time a public transportation benefit area authority assumes
15 the public transportation functions previously provided under the
16 Interlocal Cooperation Act (chapter 39.34 RCW) there are citizen
17 positions on the governing board of the transit system, those positions
18 may be retained as positions on the governing board of the public
19 transportation benefit area authority.

1 Within such sixty-day period, any city may by resolution of its
2 legislative body withdraw from participation in the public
3 transportation benefit area. The county legislative authority and each
4 city remaining in the public transportation benefit area may disapprove
5 and prevent the establishment of any governing body of a public
6 transportation benefit area if the composition thereof does not meet
7 its approval.

8 In no case shall the governing body of a single county public
9 transportation benefit area be greater than ((~~nine~~)) eleven members and
10 in the case of a multicounty area, fifteen members. Those cities
11 within the transportation benefit area and excluded from direct
12 membership on the authority are hereby authorized to designate a member
13 of the authority who shall be entitled to represent the interests of
14 such city which is excluded from direct membership on the authority.
15 The legislative body of such city shall notify the authority as to the
16 determination of its authorized representative on the authority.

17 Each member of the authority is eligible to be reimbursed for
18 travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060 and to
19 receive compensation, as set by the authority, in an amount not to
20 exceed forty-four dollars for each day during which the member attends
21 official meetings of the authority or performs prescribed duties
22 approved by the chairman of the authority. Except that the authority
23 may, by resolution, increase the payment of per diem compensation to
24 each member from forty-four dollars up to ninety dollars per day or
25 portion of a day for actual attendance at board meetings or for
26 performance of other official services or duties on behalf of the
27 authority. In no event may a member be compensated in any year for
28 more than seventy-five days, except the chairman who may be paid
29 compensation for not more than one hundred days: PROVIDED, That
30 compensation shall not be paid to an elected official or employee of
31 federal, state, or local government who is receiving regular full-time
32 compensation from such government for attending meetings and performing
33 prescribed duties of the authority.

34 The dollar thresholds established in this section must be adjusted
35 for inflation by the office of financial management every five years,
36 beginning July 1, 2008, based upon changes in the consumer price index
37 during that time period. "Consumer price index" means, for any
38 calendar year, that year's annual average consumer price index, for

1 Washington state, for wage earners and clerical workers, all items,
2 compiled by the bureau of labor and statistics, United States
3 department of labor. If the bureau of labor and statistics develops
4 more than one consumer price index for areas within the state, the
5 index covering the greatest number of people, covering areas
6 exclusively within the boundaries of the state, and including all items
7 shall be used for the adjustments for inflation in this section. The
8 office of financial management must calculate the new dollar threshold
9 and transmit it to the office of the code reviser for publication in
10 the Washington State Register at least one month before the new dollar
11 threshold is to take effect.

12 A person holding office as commissioner for two or more special
13 purpose districts shall receive only that per diem compensation
14 authorized for one of his or her commissioner positions as compensation
15 for attending an official meeting or conducting official services or
16 duties while representing more than one of his or her districts.
17 However, such commissioner may receive additional per diem compensation
18 if approved by resolution of all boards of the affected commissions.

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
