
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8407

State of Washington 60th Legislature 2007 Regular Session

Commerce, Research & Development.

1 WHEREAS, The Liquor Control Board was established in 1933 to
2 oversee the sale, manufacture, and distribution of liquor in this
3 state; and
4 WHEREAS, Many of the laws relating to liquor licensing and tied
5 house have either not been substantially amended or been amended in a
6 disjointed piecemeal manner since 1933; and
7 WHEREAS, Since 1993 there have been 91 bills introduced in the
8 legislature dealing with the sale, distribution, or manufacture of
9 alcohol in this state, 16 of those bills being introduced during the
10 2007 session; and
11 WHEREAS, The legislature has spent countless hours dealing with
12 bills that create many small exemptions from provisions governing
13 liquor licensing and tied house;
14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of
15 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That the laws
16 dealing with the sale and manufacture of liquor as well as the liquor
17 licensing in general be thoroughly reviewed; and
18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a joint select committee on the state
19 liquor laws be established to review the liquor licensing and tied

1 house laws to determine whether they should be continued in their
2 present form or reformulated to decrease the number of bills introduced
3 in the legislature each year; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of eight
5 members, four members each selected by the Majority Leader of the
6 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and
8 recommendations to the legislature at the regular session held in 2008.
