

**2SHB 1572** - S AMD TO GO COMM AMD (S-5160.2/10) **232**

1 On page 2, line 31 of the amendment, after "mail" insert "and  
2 voting center"

3 On page 3, line 9 of the amendment, after "a" insert "voting  
4 location, including a"

5 On page 4, beginning on line 10 of the amendment, after "(8)"  
6 strike all material through "~~(9))~~" on line 11 and insert "Requests for  
7 (~~absentee~~) mail ballots;  
8 (9)"

9 On page 24, beginning on line 10 of the amendment, after "(1)"  
10 strike all material through "~~(2))~~" on line 24 and insert "The county  
11 auditor shall issue (~~an absentee~~) a mail ballot for the primary or  
12 election for which it was requested, or for the next occurring primary  
13 or election when ongoing absentee status has been requested if the  
14 information contained in a request for (~~an absentee~~) a mail ballot or  
15 ongoing absentee status received by the county auditor is complete and  
16 correct and the applicant is qualified to vote under federal or state  
17 law. Otherwise, the county auditor shall notify the applicant of the  
18 reason or reasons why the request cannot be accepted. Whenever two or  
19 more candidates have filed for the position of precinct committee  
20 officer for the same party in the same precinct, the contest for that  
21 position must be presented to (~~absentee~~) mail voters from that  
22 precinct by either including the contest on the (~~regular absentee~~)  
23 mail ballot (~~or a separate absentee ballot~~). The ballot must provide  
24 space designated for writing in the name of additional candidates.

26 Renumber the remaining subsection consecutively.

1 On page 25, beginning on line 6 of the amendment, after "voter"  
2 strike all material through "~~days.))~~" on line 12 and insert "for whom  
3 the county auditor has received a request nineteen days before the  
4 primary or election at least eighteen days before the primary or  
5 election. For a request for ((~~an absentee~~)) a mail ballot received  
6 after the nineteenth day before the primary or election, the county  
7 auditor shall make every effort to mail ballots within one business  
8 day, and shall mail the ballots within two business days."

9 On page 26, at the beginning of line 17 of the amendment, strike  
10 "The" and insert "For counties that adopt primary, special, and general  
11 elections entirely by mail, the"

12 On page 38, at the beginning of line 21 of the amendment, strike  
13 all material through "~~system))~~" and insert "adopting a vote by mail  
14 system"

15 On page 39, beginning on line 21 of the amendment, after "(1)"  
16 strike all material through "shall" on line 22 and insert "With express  
17 authorization from the county legislative authority, the county auditor  
18 may"

19 Beginning on page 39, line 23 of the amendment, after "ballot."  
20 strike all material through "(2)" on page 40, line 10, and insert "The  
21 county legislative authority must give the county auditor at least  
22 ninety days' notice before the first election to be conducted entirely  
23 by mail ballot. If the county legislative authority and the county  
24 auditor decide to return to a polling place election environment, the  
25 county legislative authority must give the county auditor at least one  
26 hundred eighty days' notice before the first election to be conducted  
27 using ((~~polling places~~)) voting centers. Authorization under this  
28 subsection must apply to all primary, special, and general elections  
29 conducted by the county auditor.

30 (2) The county auditor may designate any precinct having fewer than  
31 two hundred active registered voters at the time of closing of voter  
32 registration as provided in RCW 29A.08.140 as a mail ballot precinct.  
33 Authorization from the county legislative authority is not required to  
34 designate a precinct as a mail ballot precinct under this subsection.

1 In determining the number of registered voters in a precinct for the  
2 purposes of this section, persons who are ongoing absentee voters under  
3 RCW 29A.40.040 shall not be counted. Nothing in this section may be  
4 construed as altering the vote tallying requirements of RCW 29A.60.230.

5 (3) The county auditor shall notify each registered voter by mail  
6 that for all future primaries and elections the voting will be by mail  
7 ballot only. The notice must include information on the availability  
8 of voting centers in the event that the voter wishes to continue to  
9 vote in person. The auditor shall mail each active voter a ballot at  
10 least eighteen days before a primary, general election, or special  
11 election."

12 On page 40, beginning on line 13 of the amendment, strike all  
13 material through "person." on line 22 and insert "(4) If the county  
14 legislative authority and county auditor determine under subsection (1)  
15 of this section, or if the county auditor determines under subsection  
16 (2) of this section, to return to a ((~~polling place~~)) voting center  
17 election environment, the auditor shall notify each registered voter,  
18 by mail, of this and shall provide the address of the ((~~polling place~~))  
19 voting center to be used."

EFFECT: Preserves the ability of counties to conduct elections at  
voting centers unless a county auditor has the express authorization  
from the county legislative authority to conduct all primary, special,  
and general elections entirely by mail ballot.

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
