- 1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:
- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. It is the intent of the legislature to protect wildlife from becoming habituated to humans and to protect the public against the serious health and safety risk posed by wildlife that are drawn into contact with humans and related infrastructure by individuals who intentionally feed wildlife.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 77.15 RCW 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (1) A person may not place, deposit, distribute, or scatter grain, 11 hay, or other food by affirmative conduct so as to intentionally 12 constitute a lure, attraction, or enticement for potentially habituated 13 wildlife.
- 14 (2)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, if the 15 department or an ex officio fish and wildlife officer receives complaints from two separate households, as defined in RCW 84.14.010, 16 and a fish and wildlife officer or an ex officio fish and wildlife 17 officer has probable cause to believe that a person acted in violation 18 19 of this section, the officer may issue a written warning requiring the 20 person to contain, move, or remove the grain, hay, or other food within 21 two days.
- 22 (b) If a person who is issued a warning under (a) of this 23 subsection fails to contain, move, or remove the grain, hay, or other 24 food as directed, a fish and wildlife officer or an ex officio fish and 25 wildlife officer may issue a natural resources infraction under chapter 26 7.84 RCW.
- 27 (3) This section does not apply to:
- 28 (a) A person who is hunting or trapping potentially habituated

wildlife in accordance with all other applicable provisions of this title or rules of the commission or the director;

- (b) A person who is engaged in a farming or ranching operation;
- (c) A person who is feeding potentially habituated wildlife as part of a commercial forestry operation in order to prevent or reduce tree damage;
- (d) A person who is feeding potentially habituated wildlife, with the director's authorization, to prevent damage to private property;
- 9 (e) A person who is feeding potentially habituated wildlife, with 10 the director's authorization, to mitigate the population loss 11 anticipated by a predicted winter mortality;
- (f) A person who is feeding potentially habituated wildlife, with the director's authorization, as a part of a research or management program;
- 15 (g) Waste disposal facilities operating in accordance with 16 applicable federal, state, and municipal laws; and
- 17 (h) Zoos and lawfully operated wildlife refuges, or wildlife 18 rehabilitators operating under RCW 77.12.467.
- 19 (4) Due to the documented, chronic malnutrition of the Mt. St. 20 Helens elk herd, no individual shall be issued a warning or a natural 21 resources infraction under this section for feeding elk in the Mt. St. 22 Helens elk herd management area, as identified in the Washington state 23 elk herd plan prepared by the department in May 2006, until July 31, 2019.
- 25 **Sec. 3.** RCW 77.08.010 and 2009 c 333 s 12 are each amended to read as follows:

The definitions in this section apply throughout this title or rules adopted under this title unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

- (1) "Angling gear" means a line attached to a rod and reel capable of being held in hand while landing the fish or a hand-held line operated without rod or reel.
- 33 (2) "Aquatic invasive species" means any invasive, prohibited, 34 regulated, unregulated, or unlisted aquatic animal or plant species as 35 defined under subsections (3), (28), (40), (44), (58), and (59) of this 36 section, aquatic noxious weeds as defined under RCW 17.26.020(5)(c), 37 and aquatic nuisance species as defined under RCW 77.60.130(1).

1 (3) "Aquatic plant species" means an emergent, submersed, partially 2 submersed, free-floating, or floating-leaving plant species that grows 3 in or near a body of water or wetland.

- (4) "Bag limit" means the maximum number of game animals, game birds, or game fish which may be taken, caught, killed, or possessed by a person, as specified by rule of the commission for a particular period of time, or as to size, sex, or species.
- (5) "Closed area" means a place where the hunting of some or all species of wild animals or wild birds is prohibited.
 - (6) "Closed season" means all times, manners of taking, and places or waters other than those established by rule of the commission as an open season. "Closed season" also means all hunting, fishing, taking, or possession of game animals, game birds, game fish, food fish, or shellfish that do not conform to the special restrictions or physical descriptions established by rule of the commission as an open season or that have not otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, take, harvest, or possess by rule of the commission as an open season.
 - (7) "Closed waters" means all or part of a lake, river, stream, or other body of water, where fishing or harvesting is prohibited.
 - (8) "Commercial" means related to or connected with buying, selling, or bartering.
 - (9) "Commission" means the state fish and wildlife commission.
 - (10) "Concurrent waters of the Columbia river" means those waters of the Columbia river that coincide with the Washington-Oregon state boundary.
- 26 (11) "Contraband" means any property that is unlawful to produce or possess.
 - (12) "Deleterious exotic wildlife" means species of the animal kingdom not native to Washington and designated as dangerous to the environment or wildlife of the state.
 - (13) "Department" means the department of fish and wildlife.
 - (14) "Director" means the director of fish and wildlife.
- 33 (15) "Endangered species" means wildlife designated by the 34 commission as seriously threatened with extinction.
 - (16) "Ex officio fish and wildlife officer" means a commissioned officer of a municipal, county, state, or federal agency having as its primary function the enforcement of criminal laws in general, while the officer is in the appropriate jurisdiction. The term "ex officio fish

and wildlife officer" includes special agents of the national marine fisheries service, state parks commissioned officers, United States fish and wildlife special agents, department of natural resources enforcement officers, and United States forest service officers, while the agents and officers are within their respective jurisdictions.

- (17) "Fish" includes all species classified as game fish or food fish by statute or rule, as well as all fin fish not currently classified as food fish or game fish if such species exist in state waters. The term "fish" includes all stages of development and the bodily parts of fish species.
- 11 (18) "Fish and wildlife officer" means a person appointed and 12 commissioned by the director, with authority to enforce this title and 13 rules adopted pursuant to this title, and other statutes as prescribed 14 by the legislature. Fish and wildlife officer includes a person 15 commissioned before June 11, 1998, as a wildlife agent or a fisheries 16 patrol officer.
- 17 (19) "Fish broker" means a person whose business it is to bring a 18 seller of fish and shellfish and a purchaser of those fish and 19 shellfish together.
- 20 (20) "Fishery" means the taking of one or more particular species 21 of fish or shellfish with particular gear in a particular geographical 22 area.
- 23 (21) "Freshwater" means all waters not defined as saltwater 24 including, but not limited to, rivers upstream of the river mouth, 25 lakes, ponds, and reservoirs.
- 26 (22) "Fur-bearing animals" means game animals that shall not be 27 trapped except as authorized by the commission.
- 28 (23) "Game animals" means wild animals that shall not be hunted 29 except as authorized by the commission.
- 30 (24) "Game birds" means wild birds that shall not be hunted except 31 as authorized by the commission.
- 32 (25) "Game farm" means property on which wildlife is held or raised 33 for commercial purposes, trade, or gift. The term "game farm" does not 34 include publicly owned facilities.
- 35 (26) "Game reserve" means a closed area where hunting for all wild 36 animals and wild birds is prohibited.
- 37 (27) "Illegal items" means those items unlawful to be possessed.

- 1 (28) "Invasive species" means a plant species or a nonnative animal 2 species that either:
- 3 (a) Causes or may cause displacement of, or otherwise threatens, 4 native species in their natural communities;
- 5 (b) Threatens or may threaten natural resources or their use in the 6 state;
 - (c) Causes or may cause economic damage to commercial or recreational activities that are dependent upon state waters; or
 - (d) Threatens or harms human health.

- 10 (29) "License year" means the period of time for which a 11 recreational license is valid. The license year begins April 1st, and 12 ends March 31st.
- 13 (30) "Limited-entry license" means a license subject to a license 14 limitation program established in chapter 77.70 RCW.
- 15 (31) "Money" means all currency, script, personal checks, money 16 orders, or other negotiable instruments.
- 17 (32) "Nonresident" means a person who has not fulfilled the qualifications of a resident.
 - (33) "Offshore waters" means marine waters of the Pacific Ocean outside the territorial boundaries of the state, including the marine waters of other states and countries.
 - (34) "Open season" means those times, manners of taking, and places or waters established by rule of the commission for the lawful hunting, fishing, taking, or possession of game animals, game birds, game fish, food fish, or shellfish that conform to the special restrictions or physical descriptions established by rule of the commission or that have otherwise been deemed legal to hunt, fish, take, harvest, or possess by rule of the commission. "Open season" includes the first and last days of the established time.
- 30 (35) "Owner" means the person in whom is vested the ownership dominion, or title of the property.
- 32 (36) "Person" means and includes an individual; a corporation; a 33 public or private entity or organization; a local, state, or federal 34 agency; all business organizations, including corporations and 35 partnerships; or a group of two or more individuals acting with a 36 common purpose whether acting in an individual, representative, or 37 official capacity.

- 1 (37) "Personal property" or "property" includes both corporeal and 2 incorporeal personal property and includes, among other property, 3 contraband and money.
 - (38) "Personal use" means for the private use of the individual taking the fish or shellfish and not for sale or barter.
 - (39) "Predatory birds" means wild birds that may be hunted throughout the year as authorized by the commission.
 - (40) "Prohibited aquatic animal species" means an invasive species of the animal kingdom that has been classified as a prohibited aquatic animal species by the commission.
 - (41) "Protected wildlife" means wildlife designated by the commission that shall not be hunted or fished.
 - (42) "Raffle" means an activity in which tickets bearing an individual number are sold for not more than twenty-five dollars each and in which a permit or permits are awarded to hunt or for access to hunt big game animals or wild turkeys on the basis of a drawing from the tickets by the person or persons conducting the raffle.
 - (43) "Recreational and commercial watercraft" includes the boat, as well as equipment used to transport the boat, and any auxiliary equipment such as attached or detached outboard motors.
 - (44) "Regulated aquatic animal species" means a potentially invasive species of the animal kingdom that has been classified as a regulated aquatic animal species by the commission.

- (a) A person who has maintained a permanent place of abode within the state for at least ninety days immediately preceding an application for a license, has established by formal evidence an intent to continue residing within the state, and who is not licensed to hunt or fish as a resident in another state; and
- (b) A person age eighteen or younger who does not qualify as a resident under (a) of this subsection, but who has a parent that qualifies as a resident under (a) of this subsection.
- 33 (46) "Retail-eligible species" means commercially harvested salmon, 34 crab, and sturgeon.
- 35 (47) "Saltwater" means those marine waters seaward of river mouths.
- 36 (48) "Seaweed" means marine aquatic plant species that are 37 dependent upon the marine aquatic or tidal environment, and exist in

- either an attached or free floating form, and includes but is not limited to marine aquatic plants in the classes Chlorophyta, Phaeophyta, and Rhodophyta.
 - (49) "Senior" means a person seventy years old or older.

- (50) "Shellfish" means those species of marine and freshwater invertebrates that have been classified and that shall not be taken except as authorized by rule of the commission. The term "shellfish" includes all stages of development and the bodily parts of shellfish species.
- 10 (51) "State waters" means all marine waters and fresh waters within 11 ordinary high water lines and within the territorial boundaries of the 12 state.
- 13 (52) "To fish," "to harvest," and "to take," and their derivatives 14 means an effort to kill, injure, harass, or catch a fish or shellfish.
- 15 (53) "To hunt" and its derivatives means an effort to kill, injure, 16 capture, or harass a wild animal or wild bird.
- 17 (54) "To process" and its derivatives mean preparing or preserving 18 fish, wildlife, or shellfish.
- 19 (55) "To trap" and its derivatives means a method of hunting using 20 devices to capture wild animals or wild birds.
 - (56) "Trafficking" means offering, attempting to engage, or engaging in sale, barter, or purchase of fish, shellfish, wildlife, or deleterious exotic wildlife.
 - (57) "Unclaimed" means that no owner of the property has been identified or has requested, in writing, the release of the property to themselves nor has the owner of the property designated an individual to receive the property or paid the required postage to effect delivery of the property.
 - (58) "Unlisted aquatic animal species" means a nonnative animal species that has not been classified as a prohibited aquatic animal species, a regulated aquatic animal species, or an unregulated aquatic animal species by the commission.
 - (59) "Unregulated aquatic animal species" means a nonnative animal species that has been classified as an unregulated aquatic animal species by the commission.
- 36 (60) "Wholesale fish dealer" means a person who, acting for 37 commercial purposes, takes possession or ownership of fish or shellfish 38 and sells, barters, or exchanges or attempts to sell, barter, or

exchange fish or shellfish that have been landed into the state of Washington or entered the state of Washington in interstate or foreign commerce.

- (61) "Wild animals" means those species of the class Mammalia whose members exist in Washington in a wild state and the species Rana catesbeiana (bullfrog). The term "wild animal" does not include feral domestic mammals or old world rats and mice of the family Muridae of the order Rodentia.
- 9 (62) "Wild birds" means those species of the class Aves whose 10 members exist in Washington in a wild state.
- (63) "Wildlife" means all species of the animal kingdom whose 11 members exist in Washington in a wild state. This includes but is not 12 13 limited to mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, fish, and invertebrates. The term "wildlife" does not include feral domestic 14 mammals, old world rats and mice of the family Muridae of the order 15 Rodentia, or those fish, shellfish, and marine invertebrates classified 16 17 as food fish or shellfish by the director. The term "wildlife" includes all stages of development and the bodily parts of wildlife 18 19 members.
- 20 (64) "Youth" means a person fifteen years old for fishing and under 21 sixteen years old for hunting.
- 22 (65) "Potentially habituated wildlife" includes bear, cougar, wolf, 23 coyote, deer, and elk not lawfully held in captivity.
- 24 **Sec. 4.** RCW 77.15.160 and 2000 c 107 s 237 are each amended to 25 read as follows:

A person is guilty of an infraction, which shall be cited and punished as provided under chapter 7.84 RCW, if the person:

- (1) Fails to immediately record a catch of fish or shellfish on a catch record card required by RCW 77.32.430, or required by rule of the commission under this title; ((or))
- (2) Fishes for personal use using barbed hooks in violation of any rule; $((\frac{\partial \mathbf{r}}{\partial \mathbf{r}}))$
- 33 (3) <u>Intentionally feeds potentially habituated wildlife in</u>
 34 violation of a written warning issued under section 2 of this act; or
- 35 <u>(4)</u> Violates any other rule of the commission or director that is designated by rule as an infraction."
