Background:

Washington operates on a biennial budget cycle. The Legislature authorizes expenditures for capital needs in the Capital Budget for a two-year period and authorizes bond sales through passage of a bond bill associated with the Capital Budget to fund a portion of these expenditures. The current Capital Budget covers the period from July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2011.

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not a part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

Summary of Substitute Bill:

The Supplemental Capital Budget appropriations in the amount of \$230 million are made for the 2009-11 biennium. (See Substitute House Bill 2836 budget summary document.)

Substitute Bill Compared to Original Bill:

The substitute bill changes the appropriation and funding sources for various capital projects and programs.

Appropriation: The sum of \$230 million is appropriated.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Effective Date of Substitute Bill: The bill contains an emergency clause and takes effect immediately.
