- 9 clearly state the circumstances under which the facility provides care
- for medicaid eliqible residents and for residents who may later become
- 11 eligible for medicaid. The facility policy provided to the resident is
- 12 considered a legally binding contract between the resident and the
- 13 facility. The policy cannot be unilaterally changed by the facility
- 14 and cannot state that it may vary depending upon future circumstances.
- 15 Policies used by nursing facilities must be consistent with RCW
- 16 74.42.055.

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- 17 (2) The policy under this section must be provided to residents
- 18 orally and in writing prior to admission, in a language that the
- 19 resident or the resident's representative understands. The written

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policy must be in type font no smaller than fourteen point and written on a page that is separate from other documents. The policy must be signed and dated by the resident or the resident's representative, if the resident lacks capacity. The facility must retain a copy of the disclosure. Current residents must receive a copy of the policy consistent with this section by the effective date of this act.

 (3) If a long-term care facility participates in the state medicaid program for residential care and services under chapter 74.39A RCW, then a resident at the facility whose care is paid for with medicaid cannot be transferred or discharged from the facility on the basis of the resident using medicaid as a payment source.

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
