- 1 AN ACT Relating to recess periods for elementary school students;
- 2 and creating new sections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that students at the elementary level must have the opportunity to participate in daily
- 6 recess. The legislature also finds that recess provides children with
- 7 unstructured time to engage in physical activity that helps to develop
- 8 healthy minds and bodies. As childhood obesity rates rise, it is
- 9 important to ensure that children have the time for physical activity.
- 10 Insufficient physical activity and excessive calories consumed is well-
- 11 known as a critical factor for this alarming increase in overweight and
- 12 obese children. As Washington state strives to be the healthiest state
- in the nation, we must continue to encourage our children to engage in
- 14 physical activity so they can develop a healthy mind and body.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The office of the superintendent of
- 16 public instruction shall collaborate with the statewide parent-teacher
- 17 organization to conduct and report the results of a survey of
- 18 Washington elementary schools to determine the current availability of

- recess for elementary students and the perceptions of the importance of recess in Washington elementary schools. The survey shall include, but not be limited to, the following inquiries:
  - (a) How much time does the elementary school devote for recess each day?
    - (b) Whether the amount of time devoted to recess has decreased or increased and why?
      - (c) Is recess a structured or unstructured activity at the school?
      - (d) How is recess provided during inclement weather?
- 10 (e) If recess is part of the scheduled day at your school, may an individual teacher keep a student from participating in recess for academic or discipline reasons?
- 13 (f) Do you believe that recess is a necessary part of the school 14 day?
- 15 (2) By December 1, 2009, the responses to the survey shall be 16 aggregated and reported to the appropriate committees of the 17 legislature.
