10 mayor and city council or city commission of any city or town and/or  
11 the board shall have authority to exchange, each with the other, or  
12 with the federal forest service, the federal government or any proper  
13 agency thereof and/or with any private landowner, county land of any  
14 character, land owned by municipalities of any character, and state  
15 forest land owned by the state under the jurisdiction of the  
16 department, for real property of equal value for the purpose of  
17 consolidating and blocking up the respective land holdings of any  
18 county, municipality, the federal government, or the state of  
19 Washington or for the purpose of obtaining lands having commercial  
20 recreational leasing potential.

21           (2) During the biennium ending June 30, ((2011)) 2013, for the  
22 purposes of maintaining working farm and forest landscapes or acquiring  
23 natural resource lands at risk of development, the department, with  
24 approval of the board of natural resources, may exchange any state land  
25 and any timber thereon for any land and proceeds of equal value, when  
26 it can be demonstrated that the trust fiduciary obligations can be  
27 better fulfilled after an exchange is completed. Proceeds may be in  
28 the form of cash or services in order to achieve the purposes  
29 established in this section. Any cash received as part of an exchange  
30 transaction shall be deposited in the forest development account to pay  
31 for administrative expenses incurred in carrying out an exchange  
32 transaction. These administrative expenses include road maintenance  
and abandonment expenses. The amount of proceeds received from the  
33 exchange partner may not exceed five percent of the total value of the  
34 exchange. The receipt of proceeds shall not change the character of  
35 the transaction from an exchange to a sale.

1       (3) Prior to executing an exchange under this section, and in  
2 addition to the public notice requirements set forth in RCW 79.17.050,  
3 the department shall consult with legislative members, other state and  
4 federal agencies, local governments, tribes, local stakeholders,  
5 conservation groups, and any other interested parties to identify and  
6 address cultural resource issues, and the potential of the state lands  
7 proposed for exchange to be used for open space, park, school, or  
8 critical habitat purposes.

9       **Sec. 6007.** RCW 79.105.150 and 2011 2nd sp.s. c 9 s 6009 are each  
10 amended to read as follows:

11       (1) After deduction for management costs as provided in RCW  
12 79.64.040 and payments to towns under RCW 79.115.150(2), all moneys  
13 received by the state from the sale or lease of state-owned aquatic  
14 lands and from the sale of valuable material from state-owned aquatic  
15 lands shall be deposited in the aquatic lands enhancement account which  
16 is hereby created in the state treasury. After appropriation, these  
17 funds shall be used solely for aquatic lands enhancement projects; for  
18 the purchase, improvement, or protection of aquatic lands for public  
19 purposes; for providing and improving access to the lands; and for  
20 volunteer cooperative fish and game projects. During the 2009-2011 and  
21 2011-2013 fiscal biennia, the aquatic lands enhancement account may  
22 also be used for scientific research as part of the adaptive management  
23 process and for developing a planning report for McNeil Island. During  
24 the 2009-2011 and 2011-2013 fiscal biennia, the legislature may  
25 transfer from the aquatic lands enhancement account to the state  
26 general fund such amounts as reflect excess fund balance of the  
27 account. During the 2011-2013 fiscal biennium, the aquatic lands  
28 enhancement account may be used to support the shellfish program, the  
29 ballast water program, and the Puget Sound toxic sampling program at  
30 the department of fish and wildlife, ((and)) the knotweed program at  
31 the department of agriculture, and the Puget SoundCorps program.

32       (2) In providing grants for aquatic lands enhancement projects, the  
33 recreation and conservation funding board shall:

34           (a) Require grant recipients to incorporate the environmental  
35 benefits of the project into their grant applications;

36           (b) Utilize the statement of environmental benefits, consideration,  
37 except as provided in RCW 79.105.610, of whether the applicant is a

1 Puget Sound partner, as defined in RCW 90.71.010, whether a project is  
2 referenced in the action agenda developed by the Puget Sound  
3 partnership under RCW 90.71.310, and except as otherwise provided in  
4 RCW 79.105.630, and effective one calendar year following the  
5 development and statewide availability of model evergreen community  
6 management plans and ordinances under RCW 35.105.050, whether the  
7 applicant is an entity that has been recognized, and what gradation of  
8 recognition was received, in the evergreen community recognition  
9 program created in RCW 35.105.030 in its prioritization and selection  
10 process; and

11       (c) Develop appropriate outcome-focused performance measures to be  
12 used both for management and performance assessment of the grants.

13       (3) To the extent possible, the department should coordinate its  
14 performance measure system with other natural resource-related agencies  
15 as defined in RCW 43.41.270.

16       (4) The department shall consult with affected interest groups in  
17 implementing this section.

18       (5) After January 1, 2010, any project designed to address the  
19 restoration of Puget Sound may be funded under this chapter only if the  
20 project is not in conflict with the action agenda developed by the  
21 Puget Sound partnership under RCW 90.71.310.

22       **NEW SECTION. Sec. 6008. FOR THE STATE TREASURER--TRANSFERS**

23       State Taxable Building Construction Account: For transfer to the  
24 Columbia River Basin Taxable Bond Water Supply Development Account, an  
25 amount not to exceed \$10,404,000.

26       **NEW SECTION. Sec. 6009.** A new section is added to 2011 1st sp.s.  
27 c 49 (uncodified) to read as follows:

28       **NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS**

29       Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from  
30 the state building construction account, or any other account receiving  
31 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building  
32 construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance committee  
33 to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules and  
34 regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds.  
35 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized in this act  
36 for deposit into the state taxable building construction account that

1 are in excess of amounts required to comply with the federal internal  
2 revenue service rules and regulations shall be deposited into the state  
3 building construction account. The state treasurer shall submit  
4 written notification to the director of financial management if it is  
5 determined that a shift of appropriation authority between the state  
6 building construction account, or any other account receiving bond  
7 proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is  
8 necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state  
9 taxable building construction account to the state building  
10 construction account may be made.

11       **NEW SECTION.**   **Sec. 6010.** If any provision of this act or its  
12 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the  
13 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other  
14 persons or circumstances is not affected.

15       **NEW SECTION.**   **Sec. 6011.** This act is necessary for the immediate  
16 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
17 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
18 immediately.

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1       Correct the title.

EFFECT:     Makes the following changes to the proposed striking amendment:

- (1) Reduces appropriations for housing projects by \$46.1 million.
- (2) Eliminates funding and removes the associated provisos for weatherization.
- (3) Eliminates funding for two local and community projects.
- (4) Eliminates funding and removes the associated provisos for Chehalis River Basin flood relief projects.
- (5) Eliminates funding and removes the associated proviso for the loan program consolidation board.
- (6) Eliminates four innovation partnership zone projects.

- (7) Adds state general obligation bonds for the following projects:
- (a) \$7.2 million for the department of veterans' affairs Walla Walla nursing facility.
  - (b) \$7.3 million for the WSU Spokane - riverpoint biomedical and health sciences building project.
  - (c) \$26.3 million for distressed schools.
  - (d) \$5 million for the urgent repair grant program.
  - (e) \$4.8 million for the Pierce county skills center.
  - (f) \$19,408,000 for the Grant county branch campus of Wenatchee Valley skills center.
  - (g) \$1.5 million for the Puget Sound skills center.
  - (h) \$10,350,000 for the tri-tech skills center Walla Walla branch campus.
  - (i) \$550,000 for the state school for the blind.
  - (j) \$536,000 for the center for childhood deafness and hearing loss.
