- (1) A person commits the offense of advertising commercial sexual abuse of a minor if he or she knowingly publishes, disseminates, or displays, or causes directly or indirectly, to be published, disseminated, or displayed, any advertisement for a commercial sex act, which is to take place in the state of Washington and that includes the depiction of a minor.
- (a) "Advertisement for a commercial sex act" means any advertisement or offer in electronic or print media, which includes either an explicit or implicit offer for a commercial sex act to occur in Washington.
 - (b) "Commercial sex act" means any act of sexual contact or sexual

intercourse, both as defined in chapter 9A.44 RCW, for which something of value is given or received by any person.

- (c) "Depiction" as used in this section means any photograph or visual or printed matter as defined in RCW 9.68A.011 (2) and (3).
- (2) In a prosecution under this statute it is not a defense that the defendant did not know the age of the minor depicted in the advertisement. It is a defense, which the defendant must prove by a preponderance of the evidence, that the defendant made a reasonable bona fide attempt to ascertain the true age of the minor depicted in the advertisement by requiring, prior to publication, dissemination, or display of the advertisement, production of a driver's license, marriage license, birth certificate, or other governmental educational identification card or paper of the minor depicted in the did not rely solely on advertisement and oral or representations of the minor's age, or the apparent age of the minor as In order to invoke the defense, the defendant must produce for inspection by law enforcement a record of the identification used to verify the age of the person depicted in the advertisement.
- 19 (3) Advertising commercial sexual abuse of a minor is a class C 20 felony.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. If any part of this act is found to be in conflict with federal requirements that are a prescribed condition to the allocation of federal funds to the state, the conflicting part of this act is inoperative solely to the extent of the conflict and with respect to the agencies directly affected, and this finding does not affect the operation of the remainder of this act in its application to the agencies concerned. Rules adopted under this act must meet federal requirements that are a necessary condition to the receipt of federal funds by the state."

On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "minor;" strike the remainder of the title and insert "adding a new section to chapter 9.68A RCW; creating new sections; and prescribing penalties."

EFFECT: Clarifies that a person commits the applicable offense if he or she knowingly publishes, disseminates, or displays, or causes directly or indirectly, to be published, disseminated, or displayed, any advertisement for a commercial sex act, which is to take place in this state and that includes the depiction of a minor. Adds definitions for advertisement for commercial sex act, commercial sex act, and depiction. Adds a recordkeeping component to the defense against the applicable offense. Adds a federal severability clause.
