Brief Summary of Substitute Bill

- Corrects erroneous language and removes obsolete references from the Department of Early Learning statutes.

Background:

Prior to July 1, 2006, the Department of Early Learning (DEL) existed within the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) as the Division of Childcare and Early Learning. When statutory authority was transferred, several obsolete references to the DSHS were left in code.

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not a part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

Also, outdated descriptions, such as "handicapped children," persist in code.

Summary of Substitute Bill:

The following technical corrections are made to DEL statutes:

- replaces references to the DSHS's authority with a reference to the DEL's authority with respect to regulations for family daycare providers; and
- changes "handicapped children" to "children with disabilities."

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Available.

Effective Date: The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed.
