- 1 AN ACT Relating to social emotional learning in public schools;
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 28A.300 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. (1) The legislature finds that basic Sec. 1. 5 education instruction in public schools in Washington state should include not only instruction in core academic skills, but also core 6 7 social emotional learning skills. Students with strong emotional learning skills do better in school. They are able to manage 8 9 their emotions and behavior, form and maintain healthy relationships, 10 and make positive and ethical decisions. Healthy relationships are key 11 to learning and essential for students' future success in the workplace and in the community. These students have significantly better 12 13 attendance records, their classroom behavior is more constructive and less often disruptive, they like school more, and they have better 14 15 grade point averages. They are also less likely to be suspended or 16 disciplined. The overall result is a more effective and successful classroom experience for all students. 17
 - (2) Therefore schools should be encouraged and supported wherever possible to incorporate social emotional learning skills into basic

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- 1 education instruction through appropriate learning standards,
- 2 research-based curriculum and programs, classroom-based assessment, and
- 3 professional development for educators.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) To the extent funds are available in the account created under section 3 of this act, the office of the superintendent of public instruction shall promote and encourage incorporation of social emotional learning into basic education instruction in public schools. Activities may include:
- (a) Disseminating information about promising curricula and model programs in social emotional learning;
- (b) Providing guidelines for how school districts can incorporate culturally responsive social emotional learning into basic education instruction at all grade levels;
- 14 (c) Referring school districts to high quality professional development opportunities;
 - (d) Providing grants to school districts to implement research-based curricula, professional development, and instruction in social emotional learning; and
- 19 (e) Disseminating information on how schools can develop 20 partnerships with after-school programs to support students' social 21 emotional learning.
- (2) For the purposes of this section, "social emotional learning" includes age-appropriate culturally responsive behavioral and emotional management, relationship skills, conflict resolution, interpersonal communication, cooperation, decision making, and planning.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The social emotional learning public-private 26 27 partnership account is created in the custody of the state treasurer. 28 The purpose of the account is to support the activities of the office 29 of the superintendent of public instruction and school districts under 30 section 2 of this act. Revenues to the account include any appropriations made by the legislature for the purposes of section 2 of 31 this act, federal funds, gifts or grants from the private sector or 32 33 foundations, and other sources. Only the superintendent of public 34 instruction or the superintendent's designee may authorize expenditures 35 from the account. The account is subject to allotment procedures under

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- 1 chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for
- 2 expenditures.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Sections 2 and 3 of this act are each added
- 4 to chapter 28A.300 RCW.

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
