- 1 AN ACT Relating to crimes against pharmacies; and amending RCW
- 2 9A.52.020, 9A.56.030, and 9A.56.200.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.52.020 and 1996 c 15 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) A person is guilty of burglary in the first degree if, with 7 intent to commit a crime against a person or property therein, he or 8 she enters or remains unlawfully in a building and:
- 9 (a) If, in entering or while in the building or in immediate flight 10 therefrom, the actor or another participant in the crime  $((\frac{a}{a}))$  is armed with a deadly weapon, or  $(\frac{b}{a})$  (ii) assaults any person; or
- 12 (b) The building or portion of the building entered is a pharmacy 13 as defined in RCW 18.64.011(21).
- 14 (2) Burglary in the first degree is a class A felony.
- 15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 9A.56.030 and 2009 c 431 s 7 are each amended to read 16 as follows:
- 17 (1) A person is guilty of theft in the first degree if he or she 18 commits theft of:

- 1 (a) Property or services which exceed(s) five thousand dollars in value other than a firearm as defined in RCW 9.41.010;
- 3 (b) Property of any value, other than a firearm as defined in RCW 9.41.010 or a motor vehicle, taken from the person of another; ((or))
- 5 (c) A search and rescue dog, as defined in RCW 9.91.175, while the search and rescue dog is on duty; or
- 7 (d) The property is a schedule I, II, III, IV, or V drug, listed in 8 chapter 69.50 RCW, taken from a pharmacy as defined in RCW 9 18.64.011(21).
- 10 (2) Theft in the first degree is a class B felony.
- 11 **Sec. 3.** RCW 9A.56.200 and 2002 c 85 s 1 are each amended to read 12 as follows:
- 13 (1) A person is guilty of robbery in the first degree if:
- 14 (a) In the commission of a robbery or of immediate flight 15 therefrom, he or she:
- 16 (i) Is armed with a deadly weapon; or
- 17 (ii) Displays what appears to be a firearm or other deadly weapon; 18 or
- 19 (iii) Inflicts bodily injury; ((or))
- 20 (b) He or she commits a robbery within and against a financial institution as defined in RCW 7.88.010 or 35.38.060; or
- (c) He or she commits a robbery of a pharmacy as defined in RCW 18.64.011(21).
- 24 (2) Robbery in the first degree is a class A felony.
