- 1 AN ACT Relating to applied behavior analysis services; and amending
- 2 RCW 71A.12.040 and 71A.24.020.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 71A.12.040 and 1988 c 176 s 204 are each amended to read as follows:
- 6 Services that the secretary may provide or arrange with others to 7 provide under this title include, but are not limited to:
- 8 (1) Applied behavior analysis services;
- 9 <u>(2)</u> Architectural services;
- 10 $((\frac{2}{2}))$ (3) Case management services;
- 11 $((\frac{3}{3}))$ (4) Early childhood intervention;
- 12 $((\frac{4}{}))$ (5) Employment services;
- 13 $\left(\left(\frac{(5)}{5}\right)\right)$ (6) Family counseling;
- $((\frac{6}{}))$ (7) Family support;
- 15 $((\frac{7}{1}))$ (8) Information and referral;
- 16 $((\frac{8}{9}))$ (9) Health services and equipment;
- 17 $\left(\left(\frac{9}{9}\right)\right)$ (10) Legal services;
- 18 $((\frac{10}{10}))$ (11) Residential services and support;
- 19 $((\frac{11}{11}))$ (12) Respite care;

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- 1 $((\frac{12}{12}))$ (13) Therapy services and equipment;
- 2 $((\frac{13}{13}))$ (14) Transportation services; and
- $((\frac{14}{14}))$ (15) Vocational services.

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- 4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 71A.24.020 and 2009 c 194 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
 - (1) Intensive behavior support services under the program authorized in RCW 71A.24.010 shall be provided through a core team of highly trained individuals, either directly or by contract.
- 9 (2) The intensive behavior support services shall be designed to 10 enhance the child's and parent's skills to manage behaviors, increase 11 family and personal self-sufficiency, improve functioning of the 12 family, reduce stress on children and families, and assist the family 13 to locate and use other community services.
- 14 (3) The core team shall have the following characteristics and 15 responsibilities:
- 16 (a) Expertise in behavior management, therapies, and children's 17 crisis intervention, or the ability to access such specialized 18 expertise;
- 19 (b) Ability to coordinate the array of services and supports needed 20 to stabilize the family;
- 21 (c) Ability to conduct transition planning as an individual and the 22 individual's family leave the program; and
- 23 (d) Ability to authorize and coordinate the services in the 24 family's home and other environments, such as schools and 25 neighborhoods.
- 26 (4) The following types of services constitute intensive behavior 27 support services:
 - (a) Behavior management and consultation;
 - (b) Environmental adaptations;
 - (c) Motor vehicle adaptations;
- 31 (d) Therapy equipment and supplies;
- 32 (e) Personal care;
- 33 (f) Specialized diet goods and services;
- 34 (g) In-home respite and planned out-of-home respite;
- 35 (h) Intensive training to intervene effectively with the child for 36 families and other individuals and partners working with the child in

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all domains, including the school and individualized education plan team; and

(i) Coordination and planning.

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(5) Applied behavior analysis services may be provided by a state or nationally certified behavior analyst, a licensed mental health counselor, or a licensed psychologist.

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
