- AN ACT Relating to licensing requirements for child care centers located in publicly owned buildings; and amending RCW 43.215.200.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.215.200 and 2007 c 415 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
  - It shall be the director's duty with regard to licensing:
- 7 (1) In consultation and with the advice and assistance of persons representative of the various type agencies to be licensed, 8 9 designate categories of child care facilities for which separate or different requirements shall be developed, including child care centers 10 under subsection (2) of this section, as may be appropriate whether 11 12 because of variations in the ages and other characteristics of the children served, variations in the purposes and services offered or 13 14 size or structure of the agencies to be licensed, or because of any other factor relevant thereto; 15
  - (2) <u>In developing licensing requirements for child care centers</u> operated in publicly owned or operated buildings, such as public schools or municipal community centers, in which there are existing prekindergarten or school age educational programs, the department

shall use an interagency process to accomplish the requirements of this subsection, to include consulting the state fire marshal's office regarding standards for fire prevention and protection of life and property from fire in those publicly owned or operated buildings;

(3) In consultation and with the advice and assistance of parents or guardians, and persons representative of the various type agencies to be licensed, to adopt and publish minimum requirements for licensing applicable to each of the various categories of agencies to be licensed under this chapter;

 $((\frac{3}{2}))$   $\underline{(4)}$  In consultation with law enforcement personnel, the director shall investigate the conviction record or pending charges of each agency and its staff seeking licensure or relicensure, and other persons having unsupervised access to children in care;

((4))) (5) To issue, revoke, or deny licenses to agencies pursuant to this chapter. Licenses shall specify the category of care that an agency is authorized to render and the ages and number of children to be served;

 $((\frac{5}{1}))$  (6) To prescribe the procedures and the form and contents of reports necessary for the administration of this chapter and to require regular reports from each licensee;

((6))) (7) To inspect agencies periodically to determine whether or not there is compliance with this chapter and the requirements adopted under this chapter;

 $((\frac{7}{}))$  (8) To review requirements adopted under this chapter at least every two years and to adopt appropriate changes after consultation with affected groups for child day care requirements; and

((+8))) (9) To consult with public and private agencies in order to help them improve their methods and facilities for the care and early learning of children.
