- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.120A.010 and 2010 c 76 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) Pursuant to the federal clean air act, the legislature adopts 8 the California motor vehicle emission standards in Title 13 of the
- 9 California Code of Regulations, effective January 1, 2005, except as
- 10 provided in this chapter. The department of ecology shall adopt rules
- 11 to implement the emission standards of the state of California for
- 12 passenger cars, light duty trucks, and medium duty passenger vehicles,
- 13 and shall amend the rules from time to time, to maintain consistency
- 14 with the California motor vehicle emission standards and 42 U.S.C. Sec.
- 15 7507 (section 177 of the federal clean air act). Notwithstanding other
- 16 provisions of this chapter, the department of ecology shall not adopt

the zero emission vehicle program regulations contained in Title 13

- 18 section 1962 of the California Code of Regulations effective January 1,
- 19 2005. During rule development, the department of ecology shall convene

- advisory group composed of industry and 1 consumer group 2 representatives. Any proposed rules or changes to rules shall be subject to review and comment by the advisory group, prior to rule 3 4 adoption. The order of adoption for the rules required in this section shall include the signature of the governor. The rules shall be 5 6 effective only for those model years for which the state of Oregon has adopted the California motor vehicle emission standards. This section 7 does not limit the department of ecology's authority to regulate motor 8 9 vehicle emissions for any other class of vehicle.
 - (2) Motor vehicles with a model year equal to or later than the first model year for which new vehicles sold to Washington state residents are required to comply with California motor vehicle emission standards are exempt from emission inspections under chapter 70.120 RCW.
 - (3) The provisions of this chapter do not apply with respect to:
- 16 <u>(a)</u> The use by a resident of this state of a motor vehicle acquired 17 and used while the resident is a member of the armed services and is 18 stationed outside this state pursuant to military orders; and
- 19 <u>(b) Motor vehicles purchased by a local police department, county</u> 20 <u>sheriff, fire district, or the Washington state patrol</u>.
- 21 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.16A.060 and 2011 c 114 s 6 are each amended to read 22 as follows:
 - (1) The department, county auditor or other agent, or subagent appointed by the director may not issue or renew a motor vehicle registration or change the registered owner of a registered vehicle for any motor vehicle required to be inspected under chapter 70.120 RCW, unless the application for issuance or renewal is: (a) Accompanied by a valid certificate of compliance or a valid certificate of acceptance issued as required under chapter 70.120 RCW; or (b) exempt, as described in subsection (2) of this section. The certificates must have a date of validation that is within twelve months of the assigned registration renewal date. Certificates for fleet or owner tested diesel vehicles may have a date of validation that is within twelve months of the assigned registration renewal date.
 - (2) The following motor vehicles are exempt from emission test requirements:

- 1 (a) Motor vehicles that are less than five years old or more than 2 twenty-five years old;
 - (b) Motor vehicles that are a 2009 model year or newer;
 - (c) Motor vehicles powered exclusively by electricity, propane, compressed natural gas, or liquid petroleum gas;
 - (d) Motorcycles as defined in RCW 46.04.330 and motor-driven cycles as defined in RCW 46.04.332;
 - (e) Farm vehicles as defined in RCW 46.04.181;

- 9 (f) Street rod vehicles as defined in RCW 46.04.572 and custom vehicles as defined in RCW 46.04.161;
 - (g) Used vehicles that are offered for sale by a motor vehicle dealer licensed under chapter 46.70 RCW;
 - (h) Classes of motor vehicles exempted by the director of the department of ecology; and
 - (i) Hybrid motor vehicles that obtain a rating by the environmental protection agency of at least fifty miles per gallon of gas during city driving. For purposes of this section, a hybrid motor vehicle is one that uses propulsion units powered by both electricity and gas.
- 19 (3) The department of ecology shall provide information to motor 20 vehicle owners:
 - (a) Regarding the boundaries of emission contributing areas and restrictions established under this section that apply to vehicles registered in such areas; and
 - (b) On the relationship between motor vehicles and air pollution and steps motor vehicle owners should take to reduce motor vehicle related air pollution.
 - (4) The department of licensing shall:
 - (a) Notify all registered motor vehicle owners affected by the emission testing program that they must have an emission test to renew their registration;
 - (b) Adopt rules implementing and enforcing this section, except for subsection (2)(e) of this section, as specified in chapter 34.05 RCW.
 - (5) A motor vehicle may not be registered, leased, rented, or sold for use in the state, starting with the model year as provided in RCW 70.120A.010, unless the vehicle:
 - (a) Has seven thousand five hundred miles or more; ((or))
- 37 (b) <u>Is a motor vehicle purchased by a local police department,</u> 38 <u>county sheriff, fire district, or the Washington state patrol; or</u>

(c)(i) Is consistent with the vehicle emission standards and carbon dioxide equivalent emission standards adopted by the department of ecology; and

- (ii) Has a California certification label for all emission standards, and carbon dioxide equivalent emission standards necessary to meet fleet average requirements.
- (6) The department of licensing, in consultation with the department of ecology, may adopt rules necessary to implement this section and may provide for reasonable exemptions to these requirements. The department of ecology may exempt public safety vehicles from meeting the standards where the department finds that vehicles necessary to meet the needs of public safety agencies are not otherwise reasonably available.
