- 1 AN ACT Relating to Mazama pocket gophers; creating new sections;
- 2 and providing an expiration date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Cities and counties may not apply critical
- 5 area ordinances under RCW 36.70A.060(2) to protect the Mazama pocket
- 6 gopher until the department of fish and wildlife has completed the
- 7 studies required by section 2 of this act.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The department of fish and wildlife must
- 9 conduct a biological status update of the Mazama pocket gopher to
- 10 determine if protection or management of the species is still warranted
- 11 by the state.
- 12 (2) By December 1, 2012, and within existing resources, the
- 13 department of fish and wildlife shall issue a report of findings and
- 14 recommendations to the governor and the appropriate committees of the
- 15 house of representatives and senate. The report must be based on the
- 16 best available science and include:
- 17 (a) Data on whether the population of Mazama pocket gophers are in

- danger of failing, declining, or are vulnerable due to disease, predation, exploitation, or habitat loss or change;
- 3 (b) An analysis of the historic, current, and future population 4 trends of the Mazama pocket gopher;
- 5 (c) Historic and current habitat trends of the Mazama pocket 6 gopher;

- (d) Population demographics and their relationship to long-term sustainability of the Mazama pocket gopher; and
- 9 (e) Historic and current species management activities of the 10 Mazama pocket gopher.
- 11 (3) By December 1, 2012, and within existing resources, the 12 department of fish and wildlife shall write a recovery plan for the 13 Mazama pocket gopher if protection or management of the species is 14 warranted.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. Sections 1 and 2 of this act expire January 16 1, 2013.
