EFFECT: (1) Changes the distance for the direct supervision of an

unlicensed operator from one hundred fifty feet to within a reasonable distance.

- (2) Authorizes the department of licensing to develop and implement an online training course for persons who register wheeled all-terrain vehicles and utility-type vehicles for use on a public roadway of this state.
- (3) Changes the equipment requirements for wheeled all-terrain vehicles from one stop and tail lamp to two stop and tail lamps; the two tail lamps must be used at all times when the vehicle is in motion.
- (4) Changes the one handlebar mirror requirement on a wheeled all-terrain vehicle to having a mirror on both the right and left handlebars.
- (5) Requires that a wheeled all-terrain vehicle meet the performance ability of brakes for motor vehicles currently in statute.
