1 On page 1, beginning on line 8, after "eighteen." strike all
2 material through "eighteen." on line 15 and insert "Licensed health
3 care providers may discuss sexual orientation change efforts with
4 patients under the age of eighteen, provided that such discussions do
5 not constitute the performance of sexual orientation change efforts."

7 On page 1, beginning on line 18, after "minors" strike all
8 material through "youth," on page 2, line 1
9

10 On page 2, line 2, after "efforts" insert ", while maintaining a
11 patient-driven process"
12

13 On page 2, after line 2, insert the following:

14 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** This act may not be construed to apply to:

15 (1) Speech that does not constitute performing sexual orientation
16 change efforts by licensed health care providers on patients under age
17 eighteen;

18 (2) Religious practices or counseling under the auspices of a
19 religious denomination, church, or organization that do not constitute
20 performing sexual orientation change efforts by licensed health care
21 providers on patients under age eighteen; and

22 (3) Non-licensed counselors acting under the auspices of a
23 religious denomination or church."

25 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any
26 internal references accordingly.

1 On page 3, beginning on line 3, after "sex." strike all material
2 through "therapy." on line 4
3
4 Correct the title.

EFFECT: Removes language specifying that the minors to be protected include those who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender. Places the construction in a separate section, rather than the intent section and adds that the act is not to be construed as applying to non-licensed counselors acting under the auspices of a religious church or denomination. Removes references to "reparative therapy" and "conversion therapy" in the definition of "sexual orientation change efforts." Clarifies that the Legislature finds that it has a compelling interest in maintaining a patient-driven process.

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
