

**ESHB 1287** - S AMD TO WM COMM AMD (S-4911.1/14) **669**

NOT ADOPTED 03/07/2014

1 Beginning on page 1, line 3 of the amendment, strike all material  
2 through "2022." on page 12, line 15, and insert the following:

3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The governor's office of Indian affairs  
4 must coordinate development of an inventory of lands owned by federally  
5 recognized Indian tribes, in collaboration with state agencies deemed  
6 relevant by the governor's office of Indian affairs. The inventory  
7 must:

8 (a) Include all lands owned by federally recognized Indian tribes,  
9 including trust and fee lands;

10 (b) Identify lands by owner, ownership type, location, acreage,  
11 and, if practicable, principal use; and

12 (c) Be accessible in a web-accessible format, including a GIS-based  
13 interactive map.

14 (2) State agencies identified under subsection (1) of this section  
15 must provide information and support as requested to the governor's  
16 office of Indian affairs relevant to implementation of this section.  
17 In implementing this section, the governor's office of Indian affairs  
18 may collaborate with and utilize information and other resources  
19 developed through the updated public lands inventory required under  
20 section 3174, chapter 19, Laws of 2013 2nd sp. sess.

21 (3) The inventory must be provided, consistent with RCW 43.01.036,  
22 to the governor and appropriate committees of the senate and house of  
23 representatives by September 1, 2015.

24 (4) This section expires June 30, 2016."

1       On page 12, line 17 of the title amendment, after "insert" strike  
2 all material through "date;" on line 21 and insert "creating a new  
3 section;"

EFFECT: Replaces the underlying language with a requirement for the governor's office of Indian affairs to, in collaboration with relevant state agencies, coordinate development of an inventory of lands owned by federally recognized Indian tribes.
