1 AN ACT Relating to the marine employees' commission; amending RCW
2 47.64.280 and 41.58.065; amending 2011 1st sp.s. c 16 s 28
3 (uncodified); and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.64.280 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 16 s 20 are each
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (1) The marine employees' commission, created in RCW 41.58.065,
8 shall adjust all complaints, grievances, and disputes between labor and
9 management arising out of the operation of the ferry system as provided
10 in RCW 47.64.150.

11 (2) All unfair labor practice complaints, questions concerning
12 representation, and unit clarifications must be filed with the public
13 employment relations commission and processed in accordance with the
14 commission's rules adopted under RCW 41.58.050, except that the marine
15 employees' commission shall act in place of the public employment
16 relations commission only for appeals.

17 (~~(3) This section expires June 30, 2013.~~)

1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 41.58.065 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 16 s 16 are each
2 amended to read as follows:

3 (1) There is created the marine employees' commission within the
4 public employment relations commission. The governor shall appoint the
5 marine employees' commission with the consent of the senate. The
6 marine employees' commission shall consist of three members: One
7 member to be appointed from labor; one member from industry; and one
8 member from the public who has significant knowledge of maritime
9 affairs. The public member is chair of the marine employees'
10 commission. Any member of the marine employees' commission may be
11 removed by the governor, upon notice and hearing, for neglect of duty
12 or malfeasance in office, but for no other cause. Marine employees'
13 commission members are not eligible for state retirement under chapter
14 41.40 RCW by virtue of their service on the marine employees'
15 commission. Members of the marine employees' commission must be
16 compensated in accordance with RCW 43.03.250 and must receive
17 reimbursement for official travel and other expenses at the same rate
18 and on the same terms as provided for the transportation commission
19 under RCW 47.01.061.

20 (2) The rules of procedure adopted by the public employment
21 relations commission under RCW 41.58.050 apply to state ferry system
22 employees, except that the marine employees' commission shall act in
23 place of the public employment relations commission only for appeals of
24 unfair labor practice complaints, questions concerning representation,
25 and unit clarifications.

26 (3) In addition to subsection (2) of this section, the marine
27 employees' commission shall perform the duties as provided in RCW
28 47.64.280.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
3 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
4 immediately.

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
