- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that, nationally, nearly two million students are from military families, where one or more parent or guardian serves in the United States armed forces, reserves, or national guard. There are approximately one hundred thirty-six thousand military families in Washington state.
 - (2) The legislature further finds that a United States government accountability office study in 2011 identified that it is not possible to monitor educational outcomes for students from military families due to the lack of a student identifier in state educational data systems. Such an identifier is needed to allow educators and policymakers to monitor critical elements of education success, including academic progress and proficiency, special and advanced program participation, mobility and dropout rates, and patterns over time across states and school districts. Reliable information about student performance will

- 4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.300.042 and 2013 2nd sp.s. c 18 s 307 are each 5 amended to read as follows:
 - (1) All student data-related reports required of the superintendent of public instruction in this title must be disaggregated by at least the following subgroups of students: White, Black, Hispanic, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Asian, Pacific Islander/Hawaiian Native, low income, transitional bilingual, migrant, special education, students from military families, and students covered by section 504 of the federal rehabilitation act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. Sec. 794).
- 13 (2)(a) For the purposes of this section "students from military
 14 families" means the following categories of students, with data to be
 15 collected and reported separately for each category:
- 16 <u>(i) Students with a parent or guardian who is a member of the</u>
 17 <u>active duty United States armed forces; and</u>
- (ii) Students with a parent or quardian who is a member of the reserves of the United States armed forces or a member of the Washington national quard.
 - (b) School districts shall identify students from military families in the statewide student data system beginning no later than the 2015-16 school year. The K-12 data governance group under RCW 28A.300.507 shall develop best practice guidelines for the collection and regular updating of the information.
 - (3) All student data-related reports required of the superintendent of public instruction regarding student suspensions and expulsions as required in RCW 28A.300.046 are subject to disaggregation by subgroups including:
 - (a) Gender;
 - (b) Foster care;
