- AN ACT Relating to medical assistants; amending RCW 18.360.050; and

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.360.050 and 2012 c 153 s 6 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
 - (1) A medical assistant-certified may perform the following duties delegated by, and under the supervision of, a health care practitioner:
 - (a) Fundamental procedures:
- 9 (i) Wrapping items for autoclaving;
 - (ii) Procedures for sterilizing equipment and instruments;
- 11 (iii) Disposing of biohazardous materials; and
- 12 (iv) Practicing standard precautions.

 - (ii) Obtaining vital signs;

calculated and verified by a health care practitioner. For purposes of this section, a combination vaccine shall be considered a unit dose;

- (B) Limited to legend drugs, vaccines, and Schedule III-V controlled substances as authorized by a health care practitioner under the scope of his or her license and consistent with rules adopted by the secretary under (f)(ii) of this subsection; and
- (C) Administered pursuant to a written order from a health care practitioner.
- (ii) The secretary may, by rule, limit the drugs that may be administered under this subsection. The rules adopted under this subsection must limit the drugs based on risk, class, or route.
- (g) Intravenous injections. A medical assistant-certified may administer intravenous injections for diagnostic or therapeutic agents if he or she meets minimum standards established by the secretary in rule. The minimum standards must be substantially similar to the qualifications for category D and F health care assistants as they exist on July 1, 2013.
- (2) A medical assistant-hemodialysis technician may perform hemodialysis when delegated and supervised by a health care practitioner. A medical assistant-hemodialysis technician may also administer drugs and oxygen to a patient when delegated and supervised by a health care practitioner and pursuant to rules adopted by the secretary.
- (3) A medical assistant-phlebotomist may perform the following duties delegated by, and under the supervision of, a health care practitioner:
- (a) Capillary, venous, or arterial invasive procedures for blood withdrawal when delegated and supervised by a health care practitioner and pursuant to rules adopted by the secretary:
- (b) Tests waived under the federal clinical laboratory improvement amendments program on July 1, 2013. The department shall periodically update the tests authorized under subsection (1)(d) of this section based on changes made by the federal clinical laboratory improvement amendments program.
- (c) Moderate complexity tests if the medical assistant-phlebotomist
 meets standards for personnel qualifications and responsibilities in
 compliance with federal regulation for nonwaived testing.

An applicant who has completed a registered apprenticeship program administered by a department of the state of Washington satisfies the training or experience requirements of this chapter unless the secretary determines that the apprenticeship program training or experience is not substantially equivalent to the standards of this state.
