1 AN ACT Relating to providing internet access to public school data
2 and expenditure information; adding a new section to chapter 28A.300
3 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** It is the legislature's intent to provide
6 the public and the legislature easy access to public school data. No
7 public centralized database exists with information regarding school
8 collective bargaining information. The information communicated
9 through school collective bargaining information will provide valuable
10 feedback to the public and the legislature as additional basic
11 education investments are provided.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
13 RCW to read as follows:

14 (1) The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall
15 implement, maintain, and create rules for an internet-based portal that
16 provides public access to public school collective bargaining
17 agreements and data elements provided in subsection (2) of this
18 section.

1 (2) For each public school-approved and renewed collective
2 bargaining agreement, the public school shall provide the office of the
3 superintendent of public instruction with information on the agreement
4 within sixty days of its approval. The agreement information must be
5 provided on a form prescribed by the office of the superintendent of
6 public instruction and must include but is not limited to:
7 (a) The term of the agreement;
8 (b) The total supplemental salary amount and average supplemental
9 salary per employee;
10 (c) The total number of in-service days;
11 (d) The total number of sick leave days, personal leave days, and
12 holidays;
13 (e) The maximum contracted class size by grade and overload
14 concessions;
15 (f) Additional compensation provided for time, responsibility,
16 incentives, or other purposes;
17 (g) Annual percentage of change in total salary from prior year;
18 (h) District-wide average hours of student instructional time per
19 school year by grade;
20 (i) Provisions addressing actions taken specifically to eliminate
21 the opportunity gap;
22 (j) Beginning September 15, 2015, any items, terms, policies,
23 practices, customs, or conditions in the agreement, that were not
24 included in information provided to the office of the superintendent of
25 public instruction in any prior year; and
26 (k) Whether the agreement contains a no strike clause.

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
