Providing immunity for health care providers following directions contained in a form developed pursuant to RCW 43.70.480.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Provides immunity from liability for health care providers who follow directions relating to futile treatment and natural death directives.

Changes requirements for scoring criteria status for veterans.

Allows veteran scoring criteria status to be claimed upon receipt of separation orders issued by the respective military department if the separation orders indicate an honorable discharge.

Encouraging the safe practice of public health nurses dispensing certain medications.

Authorizes a licensed registered nurse, who is an employee of a local health department or district or a clinic or facility under contract with a local health department or district, to dispense a drug or device for purposes of prevention or treatment of a communicable disease or family planning.

Grants binding interest arbitration rights to duly sworn police officers employed as members of a police force by a regional or state university or The Evergreen State College.

Authorizes public school districts and private schools to provide nasal spray to students who are in the custody of the school district or school at the time of administration.

Concerning the provision of and reimbursement for certain court interpreter services.

Modifies provisions governing the appointment of and reimbursement for certain court interpreter services.

HB 1543 by Representatives Schmick, Morrell, Harris, Rodne, and Green

Addressing the filing and public disclosure of health care provider compensation.

Modifies health care provider compensation provisions relating to filing, public disclosure, and public inspection.

HB 1544 by Representatives Lytton, Seaquist, Johnson, Smith, Sells, Ryu, Morrell, Roberts, Bergquist, Springer, Pollet, and Santos

Authorizing educational specialist degrees at Central Washington University and Western Washington University.

Authorizes the boards of trustees of Central Washington University and Western Washington University to offer educational specialist degrees.

HB 1545 by Representatives Liias, Santos, Hunt, Moscoso, Sells, Pollet, Jinkins, Reykdal, Upthegrove, McCoy, Appleton, Pettigrew, Orwall, Stanford, Tharinger, Ryu, and Farrell

Guaranteeing that the top one percent pay too, through assessing a two percent tax on millionaires to fund the paramount duty trust fund and reduce class sizes in grades kindergarten through four.

Imposes an excise tax on the receipt of adjusted gross income above one million dollars by residents or qualifying nonresidents deriving income from sources within the state.

Establishes a new state trust fund and requires revenue received by the trust to be devoted to education, with the first priority being classroom size reduction in kindergarten through fourth grade.

Requires the office of financial management to prepare an annual audit of the funds deposited in the paramount duty trust fund.

Requires the department of revenue to: (1) Administer the tax assessed in a manner that is consistent with the federal income tax system and using documents that taxpayers already prepare as part of their federal tax filings; and

(2) Refund all taxes improperly paid or collected.

Gives jurisdiction to the board of tax appeals over appeals relating to tax deficiencies and refunds, including penalties and interest.

Concerning people with disabilities who receive no paid services from the department of social and health services' division of developmental disabilities.

Requires the department of social and health services to:
(1) Expand the informing families building trust communication project to provide information about the developmental disabilities system to individuals and families on the no paid services case load;

(2) Hire the number of case managers necessary to conduct assessments to determine the level of needs of those who ask for services and those who may appear eligible for medicaid personal care; and

(3) Provide respite care for four thousand individuals on the no paid services case load for certain fiscal years.

Requires the caseload forecast council to forecast the no paid services case load portion of the department of social and health services' division of developmental disabilities to assist the legislature in developing respite needs and budget requirements for the population of persons with developmental disabilities.

Excludes from the definition of "agency," for purposes of the department of early learning, an entity that provides recreational or educational programming for school-aged children only and the entity meets certain requirements.

HB 1548 by Representatives Blake, Chandler, Morrell, and Green

Concerning efficiencies in the department of ecology processing of water right change applications that move the point of withdrawal reducing the potential for surface water body impacts.

Revises the department of ecology's process for amendments to water right change applications.

Jan 30 First reading, referred to Agriculture & Natural Resources.

HB 1549 by Representatives Blake, Chandler, and Morrell

Concerning efficiencies in the department of ecology processing of water right change applications to permit the consolidation of the annual quantities of those water rights held by the applicant.

Revises the department of ecology's process for amendments to water right change applications.

HB 1550 by Representatives Buys, Overstreet, Haigh, Lytton, Hunt, Chandler, and Ryu

Modifying the property tax exemption for nonprofit fairs. Changes property tax exemptions for nonprofit fairs.

HB 1551 by Representatives Jinkins, Warnick, Santos, Morrell, Green, Pettigrew, Clibborn, Goodman, Tharinger, Harris, Hunt, and Roberts

Concerning the performance of spinal manipulation by physical therapists.

Excludes chiropractic adjustments of the spine from the definition of "physical therapy."

HB 1552 by Representatives Goodman, Klippert, Freeman, Kirby, Morrell, Seaquist, Sullivan, Appleton, Ryu, Hunt, Stanford, Kochmar, Maxwell, Takko, Bergquist, Warnick, Manweller, Green, and Fey

Reducing scrap metal theft.

Expands metal theft provisions.

Prohibits a person from engaging in the business of a scrap metal processor, scrap metal recycler, or scrap metal supplier without first applying for and receiving a scrap metal license.

Authorizes the chiefs of police, the county sheriffs, and the Washington state patrol to inspect licensee's licensed premises and records.

Establishes the Washington metal theft prevention authority to determine the scope of the problem of metal theft, analyze the various methods of combating the problem, and develop and implement a plan of operation and a financial plan.

Requires the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs to implement and operate an ongoing electronic statewide no-buy list database program.

Creates the Washington metal theft prevention authority account.

Concerning the definition of a rural county for public facilities' sales and use tax purposes.

Revises the definition of "rural county" for purposes of public facilities' sales and use tax.

HB 1554 by Representatives Stonier, Harris, Rodne, Goodman, Ryu, O'Ban, Van De Wege, Moscoso, and Pollet

Allowing fire departments to develop a community assistance referral and education services program.

Allows the development, by certain fire departments, of a community assistance referral and education services program to provide community outreach and assistance to residents of its district.

Allows a participating fire department to seek grant opportunities and private gifts in order to support its program.

HB 1555 by Representatives Green, Warnick, Cody, Morrell, and Ryu

Concerning the education of surgical technologists.

Requires an applicant for registration as a surgical technologist to submit evidence of successful completion of a nationally and programmatically accredited surgical technology program or a surgical technology program offered by the United States armed forces.

Revises the definition of "surgical technologist."

HB 1556 by Representatives Van De Wege, Dahlquist, Morrell, Hayes, Cody, Pettigrew, Habib, McCoy, Ryu, Angel, Hunt, Goodman, Pollet, Fitzgibbon, Stonier, Dunshee, and Fey

Creating initiatives in high schools to save lives in the event of cardiac arrest.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to: (1) In consultation with school districts and stakeholder groups, develop guidance for a medical emergency response and automated external defibrillator program for high schools; and

(2) In consultation with the department of health, assist districts in carrying out the program.

Requires school districts that operate a high school to offer instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation to students.

HB 1557 by Representatives Chandler and Takko

Concerning publicly owned industrial wastewater treatment facilities.

Authorizes the department of ecology, when making loans for water pollution control facilities, to provide loans to publicly owned industrial wastewater treatment facilities that relieve a city of the burden of processing industrial wastewater.

HB 1558 by Representatives Warnick, Manweller, Taylor, and Morrell

Concerning the taxation of honey beekeepers.

Provides a tax exemption on the sale and use of feed to an eligible apiarist for use in the raising of a bee colony used to make honey bee products.

HB 1559 by Representatives Appleton and Santos

Requiring crisis intervention training for peace officers.

Requires the criminal justice training commission to provide crisis intervention training to new full-time law enforcement officers employed by a state, county, or municipal law enforcement agency.

HB 1560 by Representatives Maxwell, Dahlquist, Haigh,
Lytton, Santos, Bergquist, Sullivan, Jinkins,

Implementing selected recommendations from the 2011 and 2013 reports of the quality education council.

Implements certain recommendations of the quality education council from 2011 and 2013 reports.

Addresses the creation of a definition for professional learning; a fairness and bias review of revisions to the state essential academic learning requirements; family engagement coordinators; recruiting Washington teachers; the learning assistance program; the extended learning opportunities program; the transitional bilingual instructional program; and the highly capable program.

HB 1561 by Representatives Blake, Hurst, Schmick, Takko, Hope, Kretz, Kirby, Kristiansen, Overstreet, Tharinger, Nealey, Van De Wege, Wilcox, Klippert, Chandler, Buys, Warnick, Orcutt, MacEwen, Liias, Goodman, Haigh, Moscoso, Moeller, Taylor, Roberts, Short, Shea, Condotta, Sawyer, Fagan, and Sells Concerning short-barreled rifles.

Declares it is not unlawful for a person to possess, transport, acquire, or transfer a short-barreled rifle that is legally registered and possessed, transported, acquired, or transferred in accordance with federal law.

Requiring funding for professional development for K-12 teachers.

Provides funding and resources to school districts in order to successfully implement the teacher and principal evaluation system.

HB 1563 by Representatives Farrell, Wylie, McCoy, Orwall, Seaquist, Bergquist, Springer, Pedersen, O'Ban, Kochmar, Moeller, Fitzgibbon, Appleton, Ryu, Stanford, Maxwell, Jinkins, Hunt, Fey, Pollet, Goodman, Habib, and Santos

Concerning the disposition of surplus property for the development of affordable housing.

Authorizes port commissions, regional transit authorities, the department of social and health services, the department of corrections, the department of enterprise services, the parks and recreation commission, the department of natural resources, and the department of transportation to sell, lease, or exchange real property for less than fair market value to certain eligible organizations, or create beneficial sales terms, if the affordable housing to be developed on the property is to be occupied primarily by extremely low-income, very low-income, federally qualified low-income, or low-income households.

Authorizes local governments to sell surplus property at a discount for affordable housing if the affordable housing complies with certain guidelines.

Concerning the medical quality assurance commission.

Modifies provisions relating to the medical quality assurance commission.

Transfers certain duties from the department of health to the commission.

Adjusts the functions of the health professions account. Creates the medical quality assurance account.

HB 1565 by Representatives Harris, Green, Jinkins,

Cody, Ryu, and Morrell

Funding the prescription monitoring program from the medicaid fraud penalty account.

Authorizes money in the medicaid fraud penalty account to be used for the prescription monitoring program.

Concerning educational outcomes of youth in out-of-home care.

- (2) Meet with school personnel regarding the youth's educational performance and academic needs; and
 - (3) Advocate for necessary educational services.

Provides a sales and use tax exemption on standard financial information to qualifying international investment management companies.

HB 1568 by Representatives Carlyle, Nealey, and Ryu; by request of Department of Revenue

Concerning the business licensing service program administered by the department of revenue.

Makes administrative clean-up changes relating to statutory changes made during the 2012 legislative session for the simplification of the business licensing service program administered by the department of revenue.

Requires approval of all annexations by a majority vote of the people.

Authorizes the director of the office of financial management to file a petition to have real property owned by the state for military purposes annexed to a city or town if that property constitutes the whole of the property in the annexation petition.

SB 5078-S by Senate Committee on Agriculture, Water & Rural Economic Development (originally sponsored by Senators Ericksen, Smith, Hatfield, Baumgartner, Chase, and Shin)

Modifying the property tax exemption for nonprofit fairs.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)
