HB 1024-S2 by House Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government (originally sponsored by Representatives Moeller, Appleton, Ryu, Haigh, Cody, and Upthegrove; by request of Human Rights Commission)

Addressing service animals.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 2ND SUBSTITUTE)

Revises the state civil rights act to align state law with federal law with regard to service animals and discrimination in real estate transactions.

HB 1095-S by House Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Health & Human Services

(originally sponsored by Representatives Green, Cody, Morrell, Reykdal, Appleton, Ryu, McCoy, Bergquist, and Pollet)

Concerning nursing staffing practices at hospitals.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Establishes the Washington state patient safety act.

Requires the department of health to: (1) With stakeholder input, adopt patient assignment limits and recommend quality indicators;

- (2) Upon receipt of a complaint, conduct an audit of a hospital's compliance with the act and investigate complaints of violations of the act; and
- (3) Maintain, for public inspection, records of any civil penalties, administrative actions, or license suspensions or revocations imposed on hospitals.

Requires a hospital to: (1) Beginning June 30, 2016, submit a staffing plan to the department of health on at least an annual basis, implement the staffing plan, and assign nursing personnel to each patient care unit in accordance with the plan; and

(2) Regularly collect information regarding nurse staffing and submit it to the department of health semiannually.

Authorizes the director of the office of financial management to file a petition to have real property owned by the state for military purposes annexed to a city or town if that property constitutes the whole of the property in the annexation petition.

Requires the department of revenue, with input from a task force established for this purpose, to study certain issues relating to property tax relief programs for senior citizens, disabled persons, and veterans.

Allows school districts to exempt certain students from the performance standard for promotion to fourth grade.

Requires school districts to provide: (1) Certain services and supports before seeking the approval of a parent to retain his or her child in third grade; and

(2) Specified educational options for students who did not meet the state standard on the third grade statewide assessment in English language arts in the previous school year.

Requires the department of social and health services to: (1) Establish rules to authorize long-term care clients enrolled in a program of all-inclusive care for the elderly (PACE) to elect to continue their enrollment in the program regardless of improved status related to functional criteria for nursing facility level of care;

(2) Develop and implement a coordinated plan to provide education about PACE program site operations; and

(3) Identify a private entity that operates PACE program sites in the state to provide the required training at no cost to the state.

Requires the department of social and health services: (1) When it has imposed a stop placement, to also impose a condition on license or other remedy to facilitate or spur prompter compliance, under certain circumstances; and

(2) If an adult family home corrects a violation or deficiency that the department discovers, to record and consider such violation or deficiency for purposes of the home's compliance history.
