HB 1492-S by House Committee on Education (originally sponsored by Representatives Klippert, Haler, Pettigrew, Moscoso, Hayes, Hargrove, Buys, and Hawkins)

Concerning waivers from school year requirements for purposes of economy and efficiency.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Addresses certain waivers from school year requirements.

Removes the expiration date for waivers of the one hundred eighty-day school year requirement from August 31, 2014, to August 31, 2017.

Specifies that school districts with less than two thousand students are eligible to apply for the waivers.

Concerning accountability in providing opportunities for certain students to participate in transition services.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to: (1) Establish interagency agreements with the department of social and health services, the department of services for the blind, and other state agencies that provide high school transition services for special education students; and

(2) Collaborate with the professional educator standards board to build into existing and ongoing educator requirements that special education teachers and school psychologists receive training to be appropriately prepared to address the transition needs of special education students.

Requires the education data center to monitor certain outcomes for special education students after high school graduation.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction, if certain data is not available to the data education center, to attempt to collect the data through a single communication after the student's graduation.

Requires the department of early learning to consult with a city or county enforcement official before requiring any alterations of a family home child care facility due to inconsistencies with state building code requirements.

Creates effective and timely access to magistrates for purposes of reviewing search warrant applications across the state.

Authorizes any magistrate to issue a search warrant for any person or evidence located anywhere within the state.

Requires the director of the department of licensing to: (1) Provide written and practical practice examinations for students of schools for cosmetology, barbering, and manicuring before completion of the required training hours; and

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Establishes the Washington social investment steering committee to develop and monitor the implementation of at least one pilot program, financed by social impact bonds or other public-private financing models, which delivers prevention-focused services in areas such as early childhood development, child welfare, mental health, juvenile justice, public assistance, or other identified social or health care services.

Exempts state officers, legislative officers, and state employees from chapter 42.52 RCW (ethics in public service), when soliciting gifts, grants, or donations solely for the limited purpose of facilitation, consultation, or providing expertise to further the Washington social investment steering committee's duties.

Establishing an online alternative credit degree program. (DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Creates an online alternative credit degree program that awards degrees based on an alternative credit model to position the state to meet baccalaureate degree production goals and to serve nontraditional students who may already hold some postsecondary academic credits or life experience that can count towards a degree.

Requires Central Washington University to: (1) Host the online alternative credit degree program; and

(2) Consult with the department of early learning to target students who are early learning providers and to develop online alternative credit degree programs.

Provides that this act is null and void if appropriations are not approved.

Requires a dependent, who is a legal resident of the state, having previously been determined to be eligible for developmental disability services through the department of social and health services, to retain eligibility as long as he or she remains a legal resident of the state regardless of having left the state due to the military service member's military assignment outside the state.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the state board of education to examine options and strategies for making the high school and beyond plan a more rigorous and meaningful tool for students to identify and pursue career and college pathways beginning in the eighth grade and align their high school course-taking with those pathways.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction, in consultation with career and technical educators and directors across the state, to identify and recommend specific strategies and resources needed to embed the common core state standards and the next generation science standards into career and technical course curriculum and instruction.

Requires the professional educator standards board to examine the strategies being used to incorporate the common core state standards and the next generation science standards into educator certification.

Requires the state board for community and technical colleges to continue convening college faculty and high school teachers to design and develop courses and curricula for students in their senior year of high school who do not meet the career and college ready standard on the eleventh grade consortium-developed assessments of the common core state standards and the next generation science standards.

Requires the student achievement council to: (1) Conduct an analysis of dual credit courses offered to high school students; and

(2) Convene the state education agencies at least three times in 2014 to address tasks assigned in this act and as specified in the ten-year roadmap in RCW 28B.77.020.

Encourages the agencies mentioned above, in developing their strategies and recommendations, to consult with the workforce training and education coordinating board, labor representatives, and business representatives.

Improving the system of legal financial obligations in criminal cases to protect restitution to crime victims, ensure successful reentry, and reduce recidivism.

Establishes the restitution first act.

Improves the system of legal financial obligations in criminal cases to protect restitution to crime victims, ensure successful reentry, and reduce recidivism.

Clarifies for future use the appropriate taxation of natural gas, when used as a transportation fuel, in a manner similar to gasoline and diesel.

Clarifies the exemption from disclosure, of information relating to public utility customers, under the public records act.

Regarding fish and wildlife law enforcement.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Revises certain fish and wildlife law enforcement provisions relating to: (1) The fish and wildlife enforcement code;

- (2) Recreational licenses required for hunting, fishing, and taking wildlife or seaweed; and
 - (3) Commercial licenses for food fish and shellfish.

Requires the department of fish and wildlife to provide a biennial report on forage fish, including anchovy, herring, sand lance, sardine, and smelt, to the appropriate committees of the senate and house of representatives.

Concerning the maintenance and operations of parks and recreational land acquired through the conservation futures program.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Authorizes a county to use: (1) Up to twenty-five percent of the total amount for maintenance and operations of parks and recreational land if it has acquired rights and interests in one thousand or more acres of certain real property and has collected a conservation futures levy for ten or more years; or

(2) Up to thirty percent of the total amount for maintenance and operations of parks and recreational land if it has acquired rights and interests in four thousand or more acres of certain real property and has collected a conservation futures levy for twenty or more years and has assessed an authorized maximum levy for six or more months

Prohibits certain property tax revenue from being used to supplant existing maintenance and operation funding.

Declares the fourth Friday in November as a state legal holiday and a school holiday to be known as Native American Heritage Day.

Concerning representation of children in dependency matters.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the court to appoint an attorney for a child in a dependency proceeding within seventy-two hours of granting a petition to terminate the parent and child relationship.

Requires the state, if certain conditions are met, to pay one-half of the costs of legal services provided by the attorney

Requires the office of civil legal aid to administer money appropriated by the legislature for legal services provided by the attorney.
