1 On page 3, after line 4, insert the following:

2 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter  
3 28A.300 RCW to read as follows: (1) The office of the  
4 superintendent of public instruction shall create a competitive  
5 grant process to evaluate and award state-funded grants to school  
6 districts to pilot increased identification of homeless students and  
7 the capacity of the districts to provide support, which may include  
8 education liaisons, for homeless students. The process must  
9 complement any similar federal grant program or programs in order to  
10 minimize agency overhead and administrative costs for the  
11 superintendent of public instruction and school districts. School  
12 districts may access both federal and state funding to identify and  
13 support homeless students.

14 (2) Award criteria for the state grants shall be based on the  
15 demonstrated need of the school district and may consider the number  
16 or overall percentage, or both, of homeless children and youths  
17 enrolled in preschool, elementary, and secondary schools in the  
18 school district, and the ability of the local school district to  
19 meet these needs. Award criteria shall also be based on the quality  
20 of the applications submitted.

21 (3) Homeless students are defined as students without a fixed,  
22 regular, and adequate nighttime residence as set forth in the  
23 federal McKinney-Vento homeless education assistance act (P.L. 100-  
24 77; 101 Stat. 482).

25 (4) School districts may not use funds allocated under this  
26 section to supplant existing federal, state, or local resources for  
27 homeless student supports, which may include education liaisons.

1        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 3**    A new section is added to chapter 43.185C  
2 RCW to read as follows:

3        (1) The department, in consultation with the office of the  
4 superintendent of public instruction, shall administer a grant  
5 program that links homeless students and their families, or  
6 unaccompanied homeless students, with stable housing located in the  
7 homeless student's school district. The goal of the program is to  
8 provide educational stability for homeless students by promoting  
9 housing stability.

10        (2) The department, working with the office of the  
11 superintendent of public instruction, shall develop a competitive  
12 grant process to make grant awards to school districts partnered  
13 with eligible organizations on implementation of the proposal. For  
14 the purposes of this subsection, "eligible organization" means any  
15 local government, local housing authority, regional support network  
16 established under chapter 71.24 RCW, nonprofit community or  
17 neighborhood-based organization, federally recognized Indian tribe  
18 in the state of Washington, or regional or statewide nonprofit  
19 housing assistance organization. Applications for the grant program  
20 must include contractual agreements between the housing providers  
21 and school districts defining the responsibilities and commitments  
22 of each party to identify, house, and support homeless students. In  
23 determining which school districts will receive grants, preference  
24 must be given to districts with a demonstrated commitment of  
25 partnership and history with eligible organizations.

26        (3) Activities eligible for assistance under this grant program  
27 include but are not limited to:

28        (a) Rental assistance, which includes utilities, security and  
29 utility deposits, first and last month's rent, rental application  
30 fees, moving expenses, and other eligible expenses to be determined  
31 by the department;

32        (b) Transportation assistance, including gasoline assistance for  
33 families with vehicles and bus passes;

34        (c) Emergency shelter; and

1 (d) Housing stability case management.

2 (4) All beneficiaries of funds from the grant program must be  
3 from very low-income households. For the purposes of this  
4 subsection, "very low-income household" means a family or unrelated  
5 persons living together whose adjusted income is less than fifty  
6 percent of the median family income, adjusted for household size,  
7 for the county where the grant recipient is located.

8 (5)(a) Grantee school districts, in partnership with eligible  
9 organizations, must compile information and report to the department  
10 and the office of the superintendent of public instruction the  
11 findings of the grantee, the housing stability of the homeless  
12 families, and the academic performance of the grantee population.

13 (b) Data on all program participants must be entered into and  
14 tracked through the Washington homeless client management  
15 information system as described in RCW 43.185C.180.

16 (6) Any program review and monitoring under this section may be  
17 conducted concurrently with other program reviews and monitoring  
18 conducted by the department.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** If specific funding for the purposes of  
21 sections 2 and 3 of this act, referencing sections 2 and 3 of this act  
22 by bill or chapter number and section number, is not provided by June  
23 30, 2015, in the omnibus appropriations act, sections 2 and 3 of this  
24 act are null and void."

26 Correct the title.

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EFFECT: Retains all of the underlying second substitute and  
adds the following:

(1) A competitive grant process to evaluate and award state-funded  
grants to school districts to pilot increased identification of  
homeless students and the capacity of the districts to provide  
support.

(2) A grant program that links homeless students and their  
families, or unaccompanied homeless students with stable housing

located in the homeless student's school district.

(3) A null and void clause, providing that the two grant programs are null and void if not funded in the omnibus appropriations act.

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
