1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the  
2 following:

3 "Sec. 1. RCW 69.22.010 and 2011 c 281 s 1 are each amended to  
4 read as follows:

5 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter  
6 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

7 (1) "Cottage food operation" means a person who produces cottage  
8 food products only in the home kitchen of that person's primary  
9 domestic residence in Washington and only for sale directly to the  
10 consumer.

11 (2) "Cottage food products" means nonpotentially hazardous baked  
12 goods; baked candies and candies made on a stovetop; jams, jellies,  
13 preserves, and fruit butters as defined in 21 C.F.R. Sec. 150 as it  
14 existed on July 22, 2011; and other nonpotentially hazardous foods  
15 identified by the director in rule. No ingredient containing a  
16 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of 0.3 percent or greater may be  
17 included as an ingredient in any cottage food product.

18 (3) "Department" means the department of agriculture.

19 (4) "Director" means the director of the department.

20 (5) "Domestic residence" means a single-family dwelling or an  
21 area within a rental unit where a single person or family actually  
22 resides. Domestic residence does not include:

23 (a) A group or communal residential setting within any type of  
24 structure; or

25 (b) An outbuilding, shed, barn, or other similar structure.

26 (6) "Home kitchen" means a kitchen primarily intended for use by  
27 the residents of a home. It may contain one or more stoves or ovens,  
28 which may be a double oven, designed for residential use.

29 (7) "Permitted area" means the portion of a domestic residence  
30 housing a home kitchen where the preparation, packaging, storage, or  
31 handling of cottage food products occurs.

32 (8) "Potentially hazardous food" means foods requiring  
33 temperature control for safety because they are capable of supporting

1 the rapid growth of pathogenic or toxigenic microorganisms, or the  
2 growth and toxin production of Clostridium botulinum."

3 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "operations;" strike the  
4 remainder of the title and insert "and amending RCW 69.22.010."
