- We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. William P. Stewart (12/9/1839 12/11/1907) of 10 Snohomish served bravely during the Civil War after he volunteered 11 for service in the 29th U.S. Colored Infantry Regiment; and
- 12 WHEREAS, That military unit suffered enormous losses during the 13 war, with one out of three soldiers becoming casualties; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Stewart demonstrated tremendous courage and dedication 15 to the cause of liberty by volunteering to serve as an African-16 American during the Civil War; and
- WHEREAS, Stewart served honorably during the closing days of the war and during its aftermath in Texas, where Stewart and his unit were deployed in response to instability in Mexico due to French intervention; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Stewart was a farmer before he volunteered for combat 22 and a respected pioneer of the town of Snohomish after the war, but 23 he and his fellow soldiers received little recognition for their 24 bravery and sacrifice; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Stewart married Elizabeth Thorton and became a highly 26 respected pioneer in the city of Snohomish, where his house is still 27 standing; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Stewart is buried in the Grand Army of the Republic 29 cemetery in Snohomish along with two hundred other civil war veterans 30 who founded the cemetery; and
- 31 WHEREAS, It is in the interest of the State of Washington to 32 finally recognize its citizens who volunteered and served bravely in 33 the defense of our union;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the Washington State Transportation Commission commence proceedings to name State Route Number 99 the "William P. Stewart Memorial Highway."

BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to the Secretary of Transportation, the Washington State Transportation Commission, and the Washington State Department of
