1 On page 1, after the enacting clause, insert the following:

2 "PART I"

3 On page 2, after line 26, strike all of subsection (5) and insert
4 the following:

5 "(5) Legislative members of the summit are reimbursed for travel
6 expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative members are
7 not entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses if they are elected
8 officials or are participating on behalf of an employer, governmental
9 entity, or other organization. Any reimbursement for other
10 nonlegislative members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW."

11 On page 2, after line 30, insert the following:

12 "PART II"

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** The legislature finds that school
14 personnel are often the first responders when there is a violent
15 threat or natural or man-made disaster at a school. The legislature
16 further finds there is a need to develop training for school
17 personnel to intervene and provide assistance during these emergency
18 incidents. The legislature recognizes an educational service district
19 has developed a model for a regional school safety and security
20 center, which can provide this type of training.

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.310
22 RCW to read as follows:

23 (1) Educational service districts may implement a regional school
24 safety and security program modeled after the educational service
25 district that has developed a regional school safety and security
26 center.

27 (2) The programs should include the following components:

1 (a) Establishment of a network of school safety coordinators for
2 the educational service districts, which shall focus on prevention
3 planning, intervention, mitigation, crisis response, and community
4 recovery regarding emergency incidents in schools;

5 (b) Collaboration with the educational service district that
6 developed the model for a regional school safety and security center
7 to adopt its model for a regional school safety and security center;

8 (c) Creation of technology-based systems that enable more
9 efficient and effective communication between schools and emergency
10 response entities, including local law enforcement, local fire
11 department, and state and federal responders;

12 (d) Provision of technology support to improve communication and
13 data management between schools and emergency response entities;

14 (e) Ongoing training of school personnel and emergency responders
15 to establish a system for preventative identification, intervention
16 strategies, and management of risk behaviors;

17 (f) Development of a professional development to train school
18 personnel as first responders until the arrival of emergency
19 responders; and

20 (g) Building collaborative relationships between other
21 educational service districts, the office of the superintendent of
22 public instruction, and the school safety advisory committee."

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23 On page 1, line 1 of the title after "to" strike the remainder of
24 the title and insert "cost-effective methods for maintaining and
25 increasing school safety; adding a new section to chapter 28A.300
26 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 28A.310 RCW; creating new
27 sections; and providing an expiration date."

EFFECT: Clarifies the reimbursement policies for nonlegislative
members participating in the school safety summit.

Adds a second intent section.

Adds a section that allows educational service districts to
implement a regional school safety and security program and
identifies specific components that these programs should include.

Changes the title.

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
