

# HOUSE BILL REPORT

## HB 2771

#### Brief Summary of Bill

- Authorizes Public Hospital Districts to award public works contracts for more than the estimated cost.

#### Background:

Public Hospital Districts (PHDs) are authorized to enter into contracts for materials and labor for construction or repair projects at PHD facilities. For projects over \$75,000 the PHDs are required to publish notice for sealed bids. The contract may be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder or to the best bidder. The PHDs cannot award a contract for more than the amount of the estimated cost of the materials and labor.

**Summary of Bill:**

The PHDs are authorized to enter into contracts for more than the amount of the estimated cost of materials and labor for projects over \$75,000.

**Appropriation:** None.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.

**Effective Date:** The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the session in which the bill is passed.

**Staff Summary of Public Testimony:**

(In support) This bill will prevent the time and cost to have to rebid a project if the bid is even a little bit over the estimate.
