- 1 AN ACT Relating to working Washington special license plates;
- 2 amending RCW 46.68.420; reenacting and amending RCW 46.18.200,
- 3 46.17.220, and 46.18.060; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW;
- 4 and providing an effective date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 Sec. 1. RCW 46.18.200 and 2014 c 77 s 1 and 2014 c 6 s 1 are 7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 8 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the 9 department:
- 10 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized 11 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
- 12 plates unless otherwise specified;
- 13 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the 14 department;
- 15 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
- 16 46.87 RCW; and
- 17 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.
- 18 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special license plates:

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- (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters and paramedics special license plates must show proof eligibility by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington state council of firefighters.
- (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license 8 9 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten 10 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate 11 12 fire service. Ιf the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting 13 service before ten years of service have been completed, 14 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the 15 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer 16 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter 17 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will 18 19 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying 20 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their 21 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a 22 23 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be 24 surrendered upon conviction.
- 25 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2014 c 77 s 2 and 2014 c 6 s 2 are 26 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
  - (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special license plate fee as listed in this section.

- (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund.
- 12 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2014 c 6 s 3 are each amended to read 13 as follows:
- 14 (1) The department shall:

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- 15 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 16 46.17.220;
- 17 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial 18 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and 19 collection expenses incurred by it; and
- 20 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state 21 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
  - (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section in the custody of the state treasurer:

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- (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.
  - (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.
- 17 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in 19 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status 20 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization 21 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).
- 22 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.18.060 and 2014 c 77 s 5 and 2014 c 6 s 4 are 23 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
  - (1) The department must review and either approve or reject special license plate applications submitted by sponsoring organizations.
- 27 (2) Duties of the department include, but are not limited to, the 28 following:
- 29 (a) Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by 30 sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and 31 present those annual financial reports to the joint transportation 32 committee;
- 33 (b) Report annually to the joint transportation committee on the 34 special license plate applications that were considered by the 35 department;
  - (c) Issue approval and rejection notification letters to sponsoring organizations, the executive committee of the joint transportation committee, and the legislative sponsors identified in

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- each application. The letters must be issued within seven days of making a determination on the status of an application; and
  - (d) Review annually the number of plates sold for each special license plate series created after January 1, 2003. The department may submit a recommendation to discontinue a special plate series to the executive committee of the joint transportation committee.
- (3) In order to assess the effects and impact of the proliferation of special license plates, the legislature declares a temporary moratorium on the issuance of any additional plates until July 1, 2015. During this period of time, the department is prohibited from accepting, reviewing, processing, or approving any applications. Additionally, a special license plate may not be enacted by the legislature during the moratorium, unless the proposed license plate has been approved by the former special license plate review board before February 15, 2005.
- 16 (4) The limitations under subsection (3) of this section do not 17 apply to the following special license plates:
  - (a) 4-H license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
- 19 (b) Breast cancer awareness license plates created under RCW 20 46.18.200;
  - (c) Gold star license plates created under RCW 46.18.245;
  - (d) Music Matters license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
- (e) Seattle Seahawks license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
- 24 (f) Seattle Sounders FC license plates created under RCW 25 46.18.200;
- 26 (g) Seattle University license plates created under RCW 27 46.18.200;
- 28 (h) State flower license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
- 29 (i) Volunteer firefighter license plates created under RCW 30 46.18.200;
- 31 (j) Working Washington license plates created under RCW 32 46.18.200.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW to read as follows:
- "Working Washington license plates" means special license plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display "working Washington" and provide a space for a decal for organizations and businesses approved

38 by the department by rule.

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. This act takes effect January 1, 2016.

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
